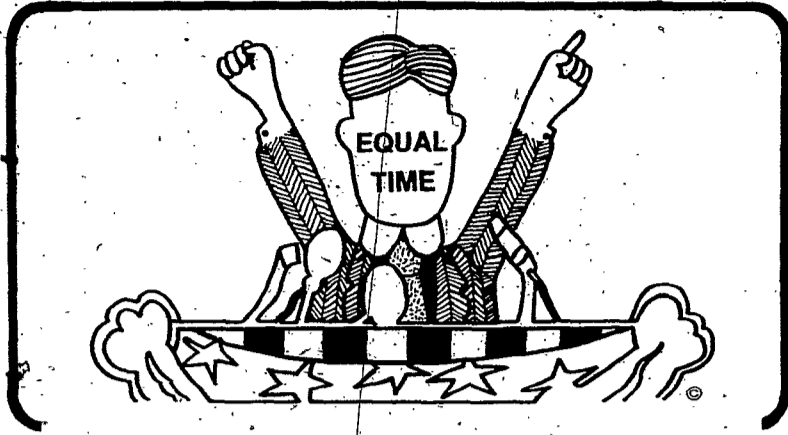


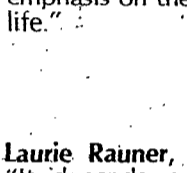

Do you feel capital punishment (the death penalty) is a deterrent to crime?

Ron Timmons, junior, band "I think it should be used for the killings of corrections officers, but for a typical homicide I don't think it should be used because the possibility of error in sentencing is too great to take a human life. A good crime deterrent is putting more of an emphasis on the value of human life."



Loretta Piccolo, senior "I don't think it is a deterrent to crime. But I do think it should be used in special cases such as in assassination of presidents, and killing of police officers. I feel that if a person is determined to be rehabilitated (after a crime) a compulsory community service program would serve the purpose."



Laurie Rauner, sophomore "It depends on the crime whether or not the death penalty should be used; mass murders, terrorist bombings. I feel if people realize that they will get the death penalty for the crime they will think twice before committing that crime."



Dennis DeMetsenaere, junior, band "My personal opinion is that they should have the death penalty for major crimes — mass murders, killing of police officers. It should be used in crimes where a lethal weapon is used such as in robberies where someone is killed."



Kathy Hanratty, freshman "I don't think they should have the death penalty. Anyone who commits a murder needs some kind of psychological help. He should be sent to jail, or some type of sanitarium to receive this help rather than being punished. There is no crime that warrants the death penalty."



Andrew Kendrot, freshman, French Club "I don't think they should use any means of killing people. Everyone has the right to life. If a person does commit a serious crime, mass murders, assassination of political persons, he should be sent to prison for life, without parole."



Eric D. Smith, senior, managing editor of the Crest "I think it has been proven that it isn't a deterrent to crime. I'm against capital punishment. It has been proven that it has been disproportionately used against the poor and the minorities in relation to the rest of society. I don't think the state has the right to take anyone's life."



Michele Quadrini, junior, field hockey "I think capital punishment does stop people from committing crimes. It makes them think before committing a serious crime like murder. Any type of killing such as in terrorist acts or kidnapping, if a person is killed during these crimes, should warrant the death penalty."
