

# Two Local Basilians Ordained Priests

Two Rochester men who belong to the Congregation of St. Basil were ordained to the priesthood last Saturday in separate ceremonies.

Arthur John McCarthy and Francis Anthony Amico are alumni of Aquinas Institute, class of 1963, and of St. John Fisher College, class of 1968. They received their Master of Divinity degrees last year at St. Michael's College, University of Toronto.

Father McCarthy was ordained at Becket Hall by Bishop Joseph L. Hogan, and offered his first Mass of Thanksgiving on Sunday, May 25, in his home church, St. Monica's.

Father Amico, who has been serving as a deacon in St. Anne's parish, Detroit, was ordained there by Auxiliary Bishop Walter Schoenherr. He celebrated his first Mass on May 25, at St. Anne's, and will offer a Mass of Thanksgiving here next Sunday noon, June 1, in Holy Family Church.

# James Shields, A Jesuit, To Be Ordained

Father James E. Shields, SJ, a former faculty member at McQuaid Jesuit High School, will be ordained to the priesthood at St. John the Evangelist Church in Greece on Saturday, May 31 at 2 p.m. Bishop Joseph L. Hogan will be the ordaining prelate.

Father Shields is the son of Mrs. Thomas A. Shields, of Rockport, Mass., and the late Mr. Shields. After graduation from Fordham Preparatory School in 1962 he attended Loyola University, New Orleans, for two years before

entering the Jesuit Novitiate at St. Andrew-on Hudson.

He pronounced his vows in the Society of Jesus in 1966. In 1969 he won a BA in History from Fordham University, College of Philosophy and Letters.

Assigned to McQuaid from 1969 to 1972, Father Shields taught American and European History and was assistant coach and moderator of the swim team and moderator of the Yearbook.

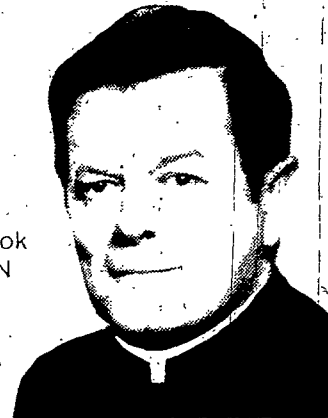
For the past three years he has

been engaged in theological studies at Woodstock College, where he has just completed his Master of Divinity degree. 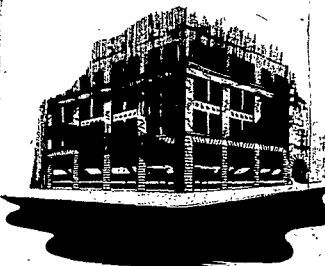

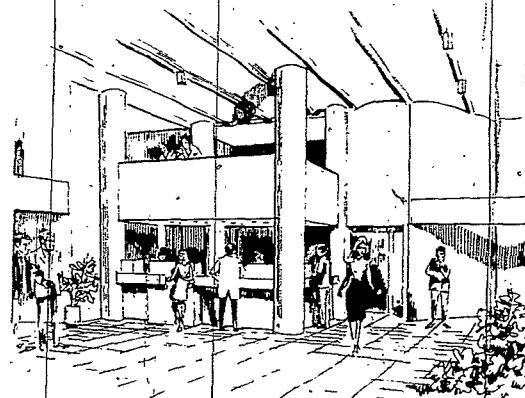
