An agreement by George Meaney (AFL-CIO) and Frank Fitzsimmons (Teamsters) was nationally publicized which recognized the right of the UFW to represent field workers and the Teamsters to represent food processing workers. The UFW called a moratorium on the boycott in good faith. The Teamsters and growers did not keep the agreement and contracts were not signed. The boycott resumed, but the Teamsters and growers had sufficiently confused the public so that it was a year before the boycott regained its full strength.


