Dryden — About 40 women attended the banquet for Holy Cross Guild June 5 at Sylvan Hills. Following dinner, Father Thomas Cleary was presented a check for \$700 for use in the church programs.

Father Cleary expressed his appreciation for the dedicated work of President Thelma Rehbein and the guild which he says has long been the "backbone" of the parish. Re-elected president was Mrs. Rehbein along with Mrs. Lorraine Drazek, vice president; Mrs. Donna Frys, treasurer; Mrs. Barbara Sweeny and Mrs. Irene Drowne.

On Sunday, June 29, a reception at 2:30 p.m. will honor Bishop Joseph L. Hogan and other dignitaries. A procession into the Church at 4:00 p.m. will be followed by Mass. Bishop Hogan will install the elected representatives of the new Parish Council.

Over the 25 years Holy Cross has grown from a mission church of a few families to an active and flourishing parish with more than 315 families. They have constructed a new church, rectory and parish center. Father Thomas Cleary has served throughout the formative years guiding its growth.

Members of clergy from many communities and faiths, alumni of the parish area, including many of the founders of the parish will return to participate. The Dryden town band will perform; the Russell Adams dance band will provide the music on Saturday evening. Dr. Ross Arnett of Siena College, one of the founders, will be returning.
