

Meeting a Pop Rock Star

The WBBF radio station studios percolated with anticipation and activity last week. Telephones rang, disc jockeys and engineers readied taping equipment while people popped in and out asking, "Is he here yet?" the "he" meaning Dash Crofts of the popular rock duo, Seals and Crofts.

Through the auspices of WBBF Seals and Crofts performed in concert at the Dome Arena on Tuesday, June 10. A few hours before the show Crofts visited the station for an interview which this reporter attended for RapAround. Being a leftover from another musical era I didn't quite know what to expect.

Upon introduction to Crofts, however, all anxieties disappeared. With a firm handshake, pleasant smile, and sense of humor he created a friendly, relaxed atmosphere. Asked about his nerves just before a show he replied, "I'm, never netwous before a performance," and laughingly added, "maybe a little sleepy!"

Being sleepy is understandable since the group has been on a hectic tour. In fact, 60 per cent of their year is spent on road tours. Rochester was just one of the stops on their present 14-week concert journey which included Europe, and a swing through the New England states. Shortly, they will head back home to California to pursue other projects which will make their fans happy; a new alblum, possible television specials and a movie:

According to Crofts, when he and Seals first teamed up they-played to university level crowds, but now their audiences range in age from 14 to 50. Song hits like "Hummingbird", "Sweet Summer Breezes", and "Diamond Girl", have wide listener appeal.

When asked if their fans really listen to the lyrics, or just to their particular musical sound; Crofts maintained audiences were aware of the lyrics. Words have more meaning than in the past,"

he explained and noted the impact on music within the last few years has been "the appreciation for words, and more types of music are accepted."

The Seals and Crofts brand of music is an interesting blend of classical, country-western, and rock. Their song creations are inspired by their experiences, the people they meet, and the Bahai writings.

Both gentlemen are members of the Baha'i religious movement.

and their beliefs are interwoven throughout their songs especially the message Crofts said they most want to convey, "unity within humanity."

A previous Seals and Crofts recording of "Unborn Child" which projected a negative attitude toward abortion caused their concert tour attendance, and record sales to drop. But "No!" was Crofts answer to any regrets about releasing the record Though it was not a success (sales wise) he insisted it was successful in its purpose. The song's intention was not to become involved in the pro/antiabortion issue, but as he said, "to make people stop and think"

Not having the opportunity to meet Jim Seals I, was curious about him. Was he as easy-going and cheefful as his partner?

"He has the same sense of humor, a little more conservative," said Crofts but then he smiled and added, "except for his hat!"
