Franciscan Addresses **Bergen Tent Meeting**

"I am a priest in good standing. I am also a Christian.

Father Edward Dillon, a Franciscan Friar, introduced himself thus to a gathering of more than 1,000 people at a tent meeting in a Bergen last Wednesday night. The meeting, one in a week of renewal, was sponsored by two Protestant churches in Bergen, but it was estimated that possibly as many as 40 per cent of those present were Roman

"I'm a Christian because my heart belongs to jesus," Father Dillon said.

"A Christian is not a person who adheres to a certain philosophy; or who practices a certain ethic or moral code, or who belongs to something. A Christian is someone who belongs to Christ in his heart."

gives us after we repent or turn from our sins. After repentance and faith comes obedience to God through the power of the Holy Spirit, Father Dillon explained. He exhorted his hearers to be faithful in daily prayer and Bible reading. "Some things you can't go without," he said.

In an interview before the meeting Father Dillon said that the only way to heaven is through Jesus Christ and a personal relationship with him. The sacraments of the Church are for those who do believe in Christ; they do nothing for those who do not believe, Father said.

Father Dillon is a graduate of St. Bonaventure University. He joined the Franciscans in 1949 and was ordained a priest in 1955. Involved in Christian renewal and revival, Father Dillon ministers to lay Franciscans and prayer groups. At the request of the U.S. Army he conducted retreats for chaplains in the Far East.
