No Reducing for DeSales Sports

Edward Tracey, named prin-cipal of DeSales' High in Geneva this month, says the Saints are not about to take a step backward in interscholastic sports.

At best it's status-quo, and hopefully there's room for expansion, he adds.

Tracey, principal at Rochester's Bishop Kearney High School from 1967-1973, spent a year as athletic director at All Hollows High School in The Bronx, New York City, and last year was teacheradministrator at St. Charles Borromeo Junior High in Greece.

His new job is a challenge because at one point within the past nine months it was announced that DeSales intended to close its doors forever because of declining enrollment and skyrocketing financial costs.

Tracey hopes to rebuild the 62year-old Ceneva school into somewhat of a regional Catholic high school, drawing from suburban Ontario County communities which lack a parochial high school.

He's still meeting his teaching and athletic staffs. Most of the latter serve as volunteers.

In the month since he took over, Tracey has met his new athletic director, Mack Spellacy, who has coached varsity track, and assisted in football and basketball for the past four seasons-at DeSales.

He's spoken with other DeSales coaches via the telephone, but hasn't met them all in person.

"One of the problems we have at DeSales," says Tracey, "is playing the larger schools If our enrollment keeps dropping, it might put us into another classification"

DeSales is rated by Section 5 a Class C school which is comparable to Harley-Allendale-Columbia, Mt. Morris, Kendall, Cuba, Arkport Honeove.

attract students from Waterloo and Seneca Falls and other areas where there are not now Catholic high schools.

"Lalready | made a statement that I don't recruit athletes whether they believe me or not. I was told 20 years ago in New Jersey that I had the pick of the parishes there. I've never given an athletic scholarship," he says.

Tracey explains that people fail to understand that parents send youngsters to a Catholic high school for the Catholic education, but often can not afford the tuition.

"You take all nine kids when the time comes from a family which can't pay, and one of the kids turns out to be an athlete. So all of a sudden you get the label you took the athlete. They forget about the other eight kids.

"They're going to accuse you of recruiting anyway. I come right back at them Look at Clifton Springs-Phelips, Palmyra-Macedon, Clyde-Savannah... everyone of the districts down here are regional districts. What are they talking about?"

Tracey says he believes in recruiting athletes for college, but definitely not for high school."I once saw a kid get help in high school (downstate) and he became a real bum. He got the biggest balloon head as a sophomore I ever saw. No way will I recruit an athlete (in high school). It's not worth it"

Russian isn't too difficult.

This is Marianne's third season at Deco which

is a day camp for deaf children, ages 6-10. Ac-

tivities include arts, crafts, speech and language development, and a rhythm band.

The word meditation conjures images of bearded recluses, and cloistered Religious spending their days in life-time contemplation. Today, however, you don't need a wooded retreat, or a monastery to discipline your mental capacities.

The Science of Creative Intelligence, Transcendental Meditation, has arrived, is increasing its followers, and is being recognized and used by business, social and educational organizations.

In Resolution Number 677 adopted by the Illinois House of Representatives in March 1972 it was resolved to strongly encourage all educational institutions, especially those under State of Illinois jurisdiction, to study the feasibility of courses in TM. and the Science of Creative Inteligence on their campuses and in their facilities because as it was stated, "School officials have noted a lessening of student unrest and an improvement in grades and student-parent-and teacher relationships among practitioners of Transcendental Meditation."

Transcendental Meditation (TM) was introduced in this country by the Maharishi Mahesh Yogi, and it is advertised as a simple natural technique of gaining deep rest and relaxation which is easily learned by everyone. Adcording to Martin Hobbs, instructor with the International Meditation Center in Rochester, TM induces rest much deeper then sleep while at the same time increasing the mind's alterness.

The two necessary requirements in pursuing TM are the ability to think, and to follow simple instructions. An interesting bit of information concerning the TM process is that drugs (referred to by those in the meditation business as "recreational chemicals") inhibit a person learning the process. Hobbs noted that drugs set up a contrast to the system which makes instruction difficult.

There are five basic phases in learning Transcendental Meditation: the introductory talk (TM's background and potential); a second lecture after which you decide if you want the course and terview session where you receive your personally tailored word (mantra); followed by three group

You then proceed into private meditation, twice a day at home, with visits to a meditation center to discuss experiences, techniques, attend advanced. lectures, and group meditations

There are FM courses available for people of allages and in all fields of endeavor. The course cost is \$125 for a working adult, a full-time college student, \$65; high school student, \$55, and a junior high enrollee, \$35.

Transcendental Meditation has not gone without its critics Cardinal Mooney senior Ann Timmerman who took the course didn't see any advantages, and The Gold Diggers of 1933 is decided it wasn't for her.
