Thomas Kicks His Way to Job

Thomas, the McQuaid Jesuit and Notre Dame University graduate whose confidence level never falls below 99 and 44/100 per cent purity, finally has an NFL address he can call his own.

Thomas, who played soccer and kicked field goals and extra points at McQuaid - during the same seasons - and who earned a page in Notre Dame football history books with his game-wining field goal over Alabama in the 1974 Sugar Bowl, recently became a full-fledged member of the Chicago Bears.

He won the place kicking and fieldgoal kicking job when the Bears peddled Mirro Roder, their regular kicker of last season, by putting him on waivers.

The decision to go with Thomas instead of Roder meant success, for the moment, for the former Rochester schoolboy who never stopped shooting for the

Thomas had previously been³ cut by the defunct Jacksonville Sharks of the World Football League and later by the Los Angeles Rams of the NFL.

He says he was kicking what must have been his 1000th field

goal attempt since last winter when he spotted Bears' head coach Jack Pardee heading his

"I knew it was squad-cutting time and I froze," Thomas ex-

"Then he said, 'You've made the team, Bob. Don't wear out your leg, it's going to be a long season.7

Thomas says Pardee observed hat he must have done a lot of kicking in the off-season because his leg was strong when he arrived at camp and it was just as strong seven weeks later.

Thomas says he sure did do a lot of kicking since last season

. He worked out during the winter with former Notre Dame gridder Brian Dougherty in Florida until the weather got warm in Rochester and he kicked a lot of time around at home until the Bears opened training camp.

Thomas was claimed by the Bears on waivers from the Rams after last season. He spent the entire preseason with L.A., but Rams' coach Chuck Knox decided to go with veteran Dave Ray who led the NFL in scoring the year

Thomas admits he couldn't argue with that.

He firmly believes his offseason practice plus his stick-toit-tiveness gave him the edge over

There were also three other kickers in the Bears camp and he had to work hard to stay ahead of

When Roder missed the Bears' first exhibition game against San Diego, because of a bad foot, Thomas booted three field goals in three attempts - including a 42-vander.

Thomas' boots gave the Bears a 9-0 lead and they went on to win,

The game marked coach Pardee's debut with the Bears and he didn't forget who helped get the win for him.

In a later game against Green Bay in Milwaukee, Thomas missed two field goal attempts in the rain, but scored on a third chance from 45 yards out.

Thomas says he made the Bears because a new coaching staff didn't particularly favor veteran players. He adds that he had almost the same distances as did Roder, but that he was a lot more accurate.

The personal gratification of knowing you may have saved someone's life is more than any other experience can offer. It is a gift to be shared and only you can give it. I strongly urge everyone especially teenagers, to give blood. If you give once, the self-satisfaction alone will urge you to give again.

As of the present, only three percent of the population of the United States donates blood. If you are interested in giving blood the American Red Cross has its donating center at 50 Prince St
