

. A Hopeful Postscript

Mt. Carmel and 58 children from St. Michael's attend 27 Catholic schools. This represents 49 per cent of the children from schools closed in the inner city.

Inter-parish sponsoring of the Catholic school ministry — a possibility which can either fall on its face or work to strengthen the school ministry in a parish, coalition, is being talked about in the city. Four parishes on the West Side of the city have been discussing the complex questions of inter-parish sponsorship of the school ministry with the diocesan Education Department since Spring. A careful process of investigation is going on among St. Augustine, St. Monica, Our Lady of Good Counsel and Immaculate Conception.

There are many ministries in the Church; it's effectiveness in serving the Kingdom of God requires this plurality. The Catholic school educational ministry which is not an alternative to the public school but must be a profound religious experience for the young of the Church — is one of the vehicles for achieving God's purposes. And, it's alive, kicking and creative.
