Philadelphia — The 41st International Eucharistic Congress will sponsor a nationwide poster contest this Fall for students of parochial schools.

Pupils in the 5th through 12th grades will be asked to convey graphically "The Eucharist and the Hungers of the Human Family" theme of the Congress. Two winners will be selected, one from fifth to eighth grade and the other from high school.

The 41st International Eucharistic Congress, a worldwide spiritual assembly of Catholics

and other Christians, will meet in Philadelphia Aug. 1-8, 1976.

Grand prizes for the contest include all-expense paid trips to Philadelphia and the Congress for the two winners and their parents.

In addition to winning a free trip to Philadelphia for Congress Week, the winners will be honored at a special ceremony following the Youth Day Children's Mass at Veterans' Stadium next Aug. 6. Congress judges will also select eight runnersup for special recognition.

Registration Hours Scheduled by Election Boards

Local voter registration days are scheduled for Saturday Oct. 4 and Monday Oct. 6 throughout the 12-county Rochester diocese. In Monroe County, Friday Oct. 3 also will be a local registration day.

The percentage of unregistered adults in the diocese has followed national trends, rising 3.2 per cent between 1970 and 1973 to 31.4 per cent. One obstacle to voter registration is the process itself. Local registration days provide citizens with the only opportunity to register at the place where they will vote. At any other time citizens must register at the county Board of Elections from 9-5, Monday-Friday. Those who need to register this fall include those who have moved since they last voted, have recently turned 18, or have not voted in the past two years.

In Cayuga, Ontario, Yates, Livingston, and Monroe counties

polling places will be open for voter registration Oct. 4, 10 a.m. - 8 p.m., and Oct. 6, 3-8 p.m. Only in Monroe County polls will be open Friday, Oct. 3, 3-8 p.m.

Registration sites will be open in Steuben and Chemung counties Saturday, Oct. 4, 10 a.m. - 8 p.m., and Monday, Oct. 6, noon - 9 p.m.

Tompkins and Schuyler counties will register citizens Saturday and Monday from 10 a.m. - 8 p.m. and from 1-8 p.m., respectively.

Polling places in Wayne County will be open from 10 a.m. - 8 p.m. Saturday and from 2-8 p.m. Monday. Seneca County sites will run Saturday from 9 a.m. - 7 p.m. and Monday from 2-7 p.m. Tioga residents may register from 10 a.m. - 8 p.m. Saturday and noon - 8 p.m. Monday.

AMERICAN REVOLUTION BICENTENNIAL 1776-1976 Your Heritage

October 9, 1779. On this day, while commanding the American and French cavalry in the attack on British-held Savannah, Georgia, Brigadier General Casimir Pulaski was mortally wounded. He died two days later aboard the American brig Wasp, and was buried at sea.

Count Casimir Pulaski (1747-1779) was one of several military "freedom-fighters" from the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth who cast their lot with the Americans in their struggle for liberty. The most distinguished of these officers, after Pulaski, was the military engineer General Thaddeus Kosciuszko (1752-1817), the scion of a noble Lithuanian family.

Pulaski had earlier led his own people in the defense of Poland, but on suffering defeat had taken the road to exile. His reputation as a cavalryman preceded him to this country, so in 1777, on the recommendation of George Washington, he was appointed chief of U.S. cavalry. In the New Jersey action he demonstrated what General Anthony Wayne termed "his usual bravery." When he died military leaders deeply mourned his loss. There was never a question of his real patriotism. As he himself wrote in 1778, "Honor and a true desire of distinguishing myself in defense of Liberty was the only motive that fired my breast for the cause of the United States."
