



Notes, Quotes and Anecdotes: Delaware coach Tubby Raymond has twice been named Kodak Coach-of-the Year. Eddie Robinson is the black coach at Grambling which has sent more players to the pros than any other college.

They were yakking together at one of the Kodak eating and drinking and oratorical marathons when Raymond mentioned the problem of recruiting on a "need" basis, by which scholarship help is determined on a player's family's ability to help pick-up the tab. "We are looking for great athletes from rich families," said Raymond. "We want bank presidents with sons who can play football."

"Funny," said Robinson, "but we never have that problem."

Robinson told a story about his hyped-up pre-game pep talk. He told his team before the game his mother and father both were hospitalized and critically ill, and begged their son the coach to win this big game for them.

"We started the game," reports Robinson, whose parents were Double-A healthy, "and the other side scored four touchdowns the first four times it got the ball. My team huddled before the next kickoff play and one of my co-captains said, 'Well, guys, we can relax now. Coach's mother and father both must be gone by now.'"

John McKay of Southern California says he did object to the rule against the same team appearing each New Year's Day in the Rose Bowl. "At least," said McKay, "in the case of Ohio State."

McKay says it's simple to become a successful big time coach. You get an O.J. Simpson and an Anthony Davis and you just point him the right direction and tell him to do it fast."

McKay has a book, entitled simply "McKay," and it's full of wisdom. He says discipline is important to coaching, but that nobody talks about it like George Allen of the Redskins. "He can't meet you without telling you how hard he works. Like, 'Hey, John, would you believe I worked 27 hours yesterday?'"

McKay says the more money a family has, the less pressure on the kids to mature. That kids from wealthy families may have a more difficult time in life, because it comes as a shock to them when they have to accept responsibility.

Introduced as a banquet speaker, McKay was labeled a decorated World War II tail gunner in a B-29. "Was I good? Outstanding. I never shot down any planes but I never shot myself either. Sitting in the back of a B-29 taught me two things: How to meditate and how to smoke cigars."

Purdue coach Alex Agase has a stock opening for alumni banquet audiences. "If you want to advise me, do it between 1 and 4 o'clock on Saturday afternoons.
