

Adios to Spanish Bishop Critical of Government

Madrid [RNS] — An auxiliary bishop of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Madrid who wrote a pastoral letter reportedly harshly critical of the Spanish government has been sent out of the country by his religious superior.

On orders of Cardinal Vicente Enrique y Tarancón, archbishop of Madrid, Bishop Alberto Iniesta Jimenez left by air for Rome for an "indefinite" vacation after the bishop's letter was read at Sunday Masses Oct. 5 in Madrid working-class suburbs.

Five priests who read the letter at services were arrested by the police.

Church sources here said that Bishop Iniesta Jimenez, whose letter "referred to recent events in Spain," would be away "indefinitely."

St. Augustine's Plans Charismatic Retreat

The prophet Haggai, in the year 520 B.C., was moved by God to urge the Jews to resume the work of rebuilding the temple in Jerusalem.

After much prayer, fasting, and waiting on the Lord, a core group of parishioners at St. Augustine Church, under the leadership of the parish staff, felt the Lord prompting them much as He did the prophet Haggai in the Old Testament. The result is a charismatic retreat for the parish scheduled the week of Nov. 2-7. St. Augustine Church is at 410, Chili Ave. in Rochester. The theme will be A Week with the Lord Jesus.

Father James Fallon from the Emmaus House of Prayer, Syracuse, will direct the retreat. He will be assisted by the People of HOPE, a community of

Christians living in the spirit of the charismatic renewal in the Catholic Church. Their community is in Convent Station, New Jersey.

The week will open with a service on Sunday evening, Nov. 2, at 8 o'clock. There will be two sessions daily, Monday through Friday. The 10 a.m. session will be repeated daily at 8 p.m. for the benefit of those unable to attend the morning program. Babysitting will be provided.

Included in the sessions will be singing, praying, and personal testimonies. Also included will be teachings that proclaim the basic truths of Christianity: God's Great Love For Me; Repentance For Past Sins; Jesus Is Lord And Savior; The Gift Of God's Love — The Holy Spirit; Healing — God Wants To Make Us Whole; Celebration Of The Eucharist — Living The New Life Of God.

The action came as the Spanish cabinet met in special session under Premier Carlos Arias Navarro to discuss possible measures to deal with the resurgence of terrorist action that resulted in the death of three civil guards in the Basque country.

On Oct. 5 activists of the Basque separatist movement ETA lured civil guards into ambush by raising the Basque flag, banned in Spain, over a monastery in a town southeast of Bilbao. The guards went to investigate. When they returned the terrorists exploded a land mine placed near the road. Three guards were killed instantly; two others were seriously injured.

The attack was seen as a response to the Madrid government's execution on Sept. 27 of two Basque separatists, found guilty by military courts of killing a civil guard.

The execution of the two Basques and of three members of an urban guerrilla group called the Revolutionary Anti-Fascist Patriotic Front — set off a wave of international protests and demonstrations.

Every European government, except Ireland, recalled its ambassador from Madrid or kept them home "for consultations."

Pope Paul, while deploring terroristic acts, denounced the executions as "murderous repression."

Mother Teresa To Speak In Philadelphia

Philadelphia — Mother Teresa from Calcutta, India, who has devoted most of her life to the poor, will be one of the keynote speakers during the 41st International Eucharistic Congress.

Founder of the Missionaries of Charity, who responded to a call nearly 30 years ago to work with the poor in Calcutta, Mother Teresa, Church authorities say, has done more to comfort the poor and suffering in India and a dozen other nations than anyone else in the world.

The congress is a spiritual assembly of Catholics and other Christians gathering here Aug. 1-8 next year.

Mother Teresa will speak on Tuesday, Aug. 3, during Suffering People Day. The sub-theme for that day will be "The Eucharist and the Hunger for Freedom and Justice."

Overall theme for the Congress is "The Eucharist and the Hungers of the Human Family."

Oct. 30, 1936 Death of Monsignor John J. Burke, CSP, first general secretary, Administrative Board, National Catholic Welfare Conference. Some people are gifted as organizers. One such was Father John J. Burke, a member of the Paulist Fathers, and for many years editor of the Paulist monthly, Catholic World, and manager of the Paulist publication society. When the United States entered World War I in 1917, Father Burke came up with a plan to organize the American hierarchy for wartime cooperation. The National Catholic War Council, of which he was named director, was so successful that after the war, the bishops decided to set up a permanent cooperative organization, the National Catholic Welfare Council [re-named National Catholic Welfare Conference in 1922]. Father Burke held the post of general secretary of this new Conference from 1919 until his death in 1936. After the Second Vatican Council, the NCWC was replaced, as an executive organization, by the United States Catholic Conference. The success of both of these peacetime associations is traceable largely to the peioneer efforts of John J. Burke — Rochester Diocesan Bicentennial Committee.

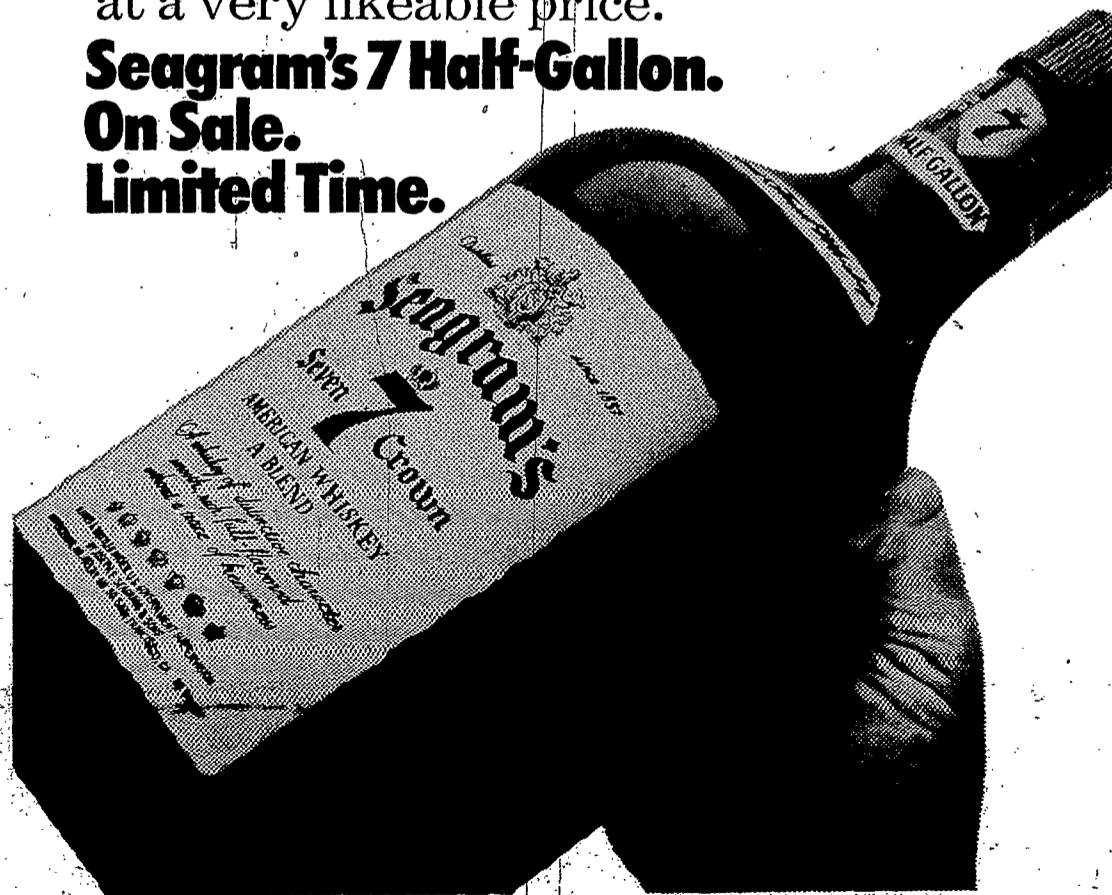
Spencerport — Seventeen children from St. John's first pre-kindergarten program recently visited an apple farm in Hilton where they picked pumpkins and apples.
