

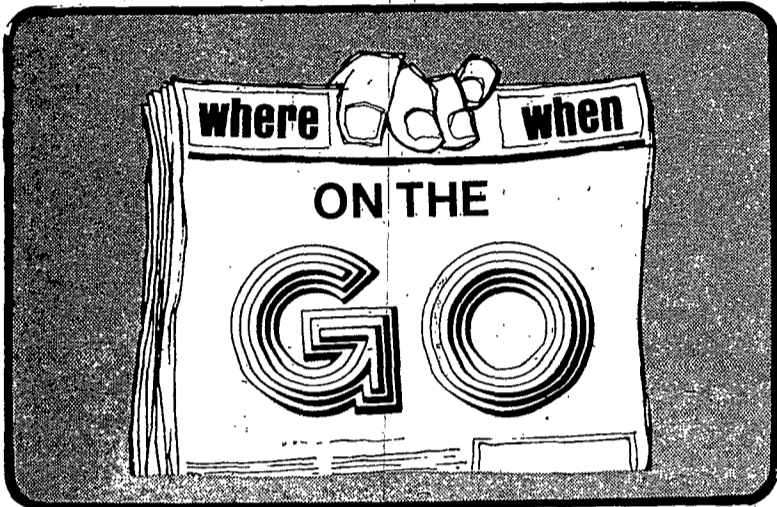

jail have said that Patty seemed a complete stranger, not at all like the Patricia Hearst they knew before Feb. 4, 1974.

Some people think her kidnapping was not staged. They believe that by some means the SLA (Symbionese Liberation Army) converted Patty into a revolutionist. Others believe that Patty was a member of the SLA before her kidnapping.

I do not think Patty helped plan her own kidnapping. Those who are closest to Patty and feel they know her best think she must have been brainwashed or drugged to have changed so drastically in two short months. I tend to agree that something must have been done to her to have her act this way.

After 19 months with the SLA she is being arraigned for such charges as armed bank robbery and violation of the Federal Firearms Act. These are only two of the 22 charges she may have to face.

Now some people feel that Patty is mentally ill. If she is, I feel the SLA should be blamed. Although I don't approve of some of her lifestyles before the kidnapping, I don't feel that Patricia Hearst was a revolutionist before her capture.

What really happened to Patty Hearst? Could she have so easily turned around two months after she was kidnapped and called her parents and fiancée "pigs"?

Everyone has his own opinion of what happened to the daughter of the wealthy San Francisco publisher. It will be interesting to see how the entire affair comes out. Will we ever know the truth? There is only one person who really knows the truth, or does she?

I feel that Patricia Hearst was abducted against her will. The SLA changed the secure and non-violent heiress into Tania the "urban guerilla." Visitors to the
