to clobber DJ this time, even though both Baltimore and the Yankees were rated ahead of the Sox during spring training of '75.

Johnson's pennant victory gave Rochester's George Sisler a vicarious thrill. It was Sisler, then general manager of the Red Wings, who picked Johnson out of the Baltimore bullpen, where he was a little-used third string catcher, to manage the Red Wings. That was Johnson's first managerial job.

That was in 1963, and Sisler, now president of the International League with headquarters here, recalls that he was not able to give Johnson "The horses he needed to win... But somehow, he won a Governors' Cup for us, and I remember well that we didn't even have a shortstop."

Long before Johnson's success in Boston, Sisler would tell associates that Darrell was by far the best manager he ever had. Sisler liked the way Johnson stressed fundamentals. This may sound trite, but Johnson-managed ballclubs make the extra play. They hit the cutoff men, they back up the lines, et cetera. It is an unspectacular virtue, and it is fact that many big league clubs forget these things once they break spring training camp. These are little things, often unnoticed, that prevent the other ballclub from getting the big inning. When you analyze a 5-4 victory, you can look back at little extra defensive measures that prevented the other side from scoring that extra run or runs.

It started here, Johnson's managerial career. He spent three seasons at 500 Norton St., and went on to suffer some disappointments. He worked in Elmira, which also once starred his Baltimore rival, Earl Weaver. Johnson went to Boston as a pitching coach under Dick Williams, who won a pennant but could not stand off the Boston press very long. When Williams went, Johnson was dumped out to Louisville. In 1973 Johnson led the Red Sox Pawtucket farm club to minor league success, and then came the break.

At one point Johnson had a choice: Scouting or quitting. That was in 1970, and he stayed with it, scouting, despite no managerial offer anywhere in the Sox system.

DJ may or may not survive the Boston press — how many do? — but he's proven something with one championship in only two tries. The applause in the background is from George Sisler & Company.

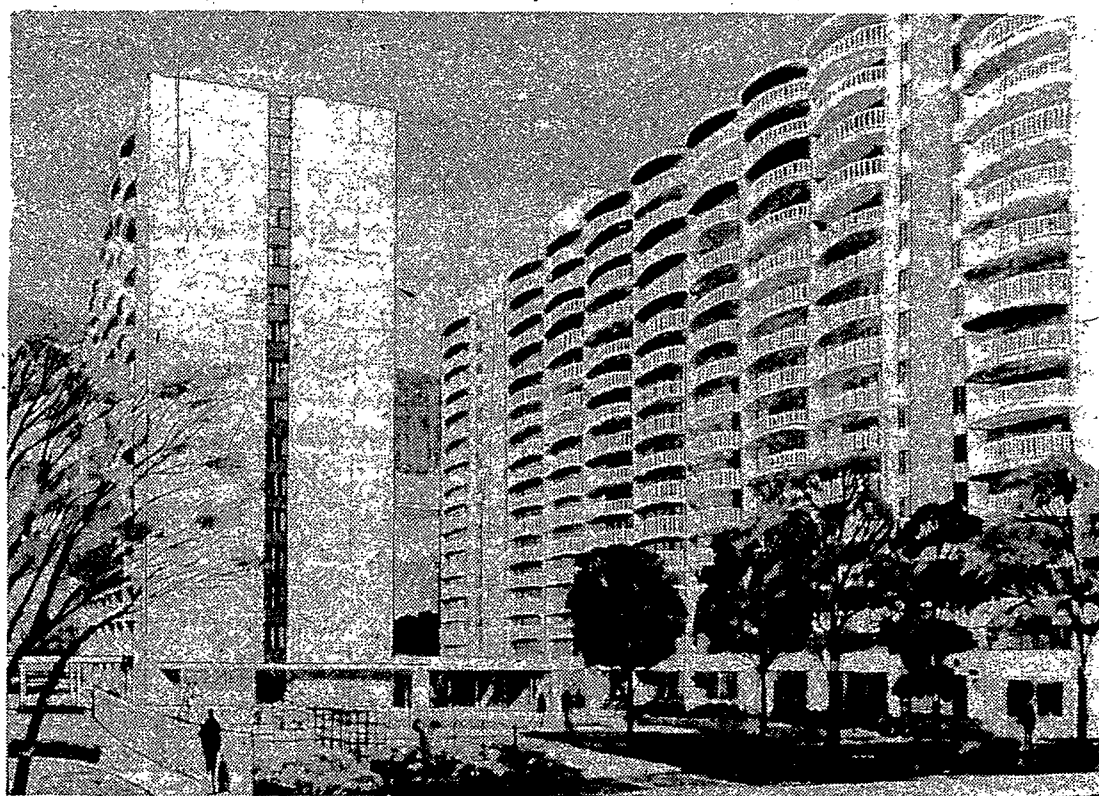
