

Bishops Give \$2,000 To Auburn Center

Auburn — The Auburn Hospitality Association Inc. recently announced that it has received \$2,000 in donations from the Catholic bishops of New York City, Syracuse, Buffalo and Brooklyn.

The donations of \$500 each represent the concern of these dioceses for members who are now residents of the Auburn Correctional Facility.

The Diocese of Rochester has contributed money and Bishop Joseph L. Hogan has offered his support during a radiothon last December. Grants have been received through the Human Development Task Force as well.

Contributions will be used for the general funding of the association which operates the center across the street from the prison. The center offers a place to rest and wait, snacks, babysitting and other services to visitors to the prison.

Keith Batman, director of the association said that these contributions are the first received from regionally organized groups outside the area.

Rev. William Walter, chairman of the fund-raising committee, said the donations represent, "a statement of willingness to cross regional boundaries and to assist with our attempts to maintain the integrity of family ties."

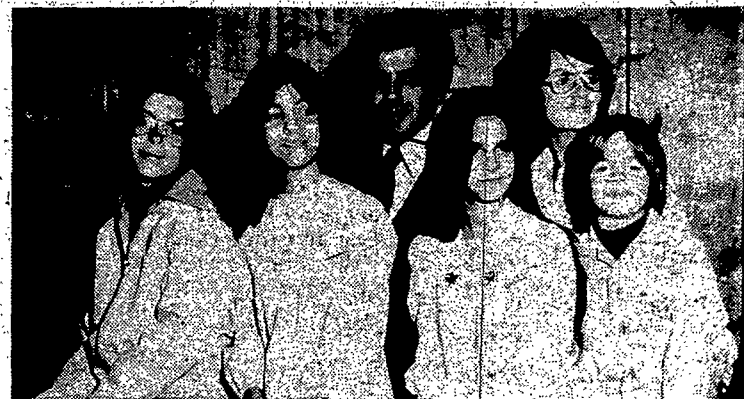
