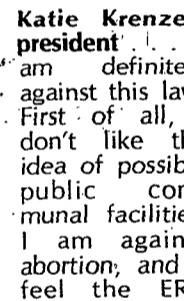
Bridgette Burch, junior, glee club "I want the ERA passed. I think if women have the ability to do some things I don't think anyone has the right to say they can't do them. Take for instance the women who want to work on construction, or be lawyers and doctors - they have a hard time in these professions - the ERA will help them."



Sue Marlowe, senior "No. I think if they want to pass a law about equal rights it should be stated more clearly in matters such as military duty. It should give a woman the choice of whether she wants to join the military, or not - she should not be obligated. I do think the ERA should be more clearly stated. People aren't ready for the drastic changes this law is going to cause."



Katie Krenzer, junior, class president "I am definitely against this law. First of all, I don't like the idea of possible public communal facilities. I am against abortion, and I feel the ERA supports abortion, and about the drafting issue - I don't want to go to war - and also, because I'm an old-fashioned country girl I still feel women are going too far in wanting to do things."



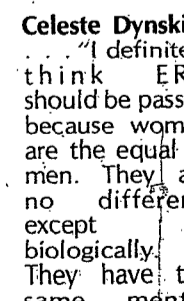
Lorraine Serpe, sophomore, volley ball "I would want it passed because it will open the doors for women in all fields. I feel the law should be on the books so that women will no longer be discriminated against in the military, and in industry. As for myself I wouldn't mind serving in the military."



Carol Zengerle, senior, basketball "I think it should be passed. I think it is vital to the female community, and it is essential that they have a legal way to express themselves. In the church, it would mean perhaps having to ordain women priests which would be a great accomplishment. In regards to the draft status... I don't see why not... if they object to fighting they can list themselves as conscientious objectors."



Celeste Dynski, junior, glee club "I definitely think ERA should be passed because women are the equal of men. They are no different, except biologically. They have the same mental capacity as anyone else. Women have long been oppressed. Though times have changed so that they are gradually being recognized as equal there is still a feeling of bigotry against them. I realize ERA won't change this feeling, but I would like to think it would."
