CYO coaches' orientation is scheduled for all coaches on Saturday, Nov. 15, at Cardinal Mooney High School.

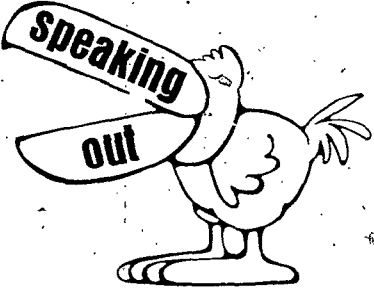

People of all nations hope that the latest peace agreement in the Middle East will prevent another war. The leaders of both Israel and Egypt concede that it would be the final one.

agreed that the Middle East conflict must be resolved by peaceful, not military means.

Both these countries have spent billions of dollars to replace the supplies used in the last war and the territorial see-saw gained little for either side.

Yet, people in both Israel and Egypt are pessimistic. The Israeli people feel that Henry Kissinger gave Egypt too many concessions, and forced the agreement on them by threatening to withdraw aid. Egypt threatened another war unless the peace agreement was implemented.

Neither country can afford another war. Egypt is on the brink of economic collapse, and the Israeli tax rate is among the highest in the world.

It is my opinion that no one can expect a lasting peace with their current attitudes. Both sides must come to realize that further skirmishes are useless.

In addition, both the U.S. and Russia are guilty of using the area as a demonstration area of national will and diplomacy. The Egyptian economy is subsidized by Russian aid, while the United States allows Israel to buy billions in military hardware.

While we are quick to charge the Soviet Union with domination, we did not include them in the agreement. In addition, this agreement does not include Syria or the Palestinian refugees.

In theory, the U.S. will be the impartial umpire. American observers will be stationed with both sides. Also, we will operate on our own, six other surveillance stations. Unlike previous agreements, this one is not secret, and I hope future ones will be kept that way.

The most important part of this agreement is that both sides have
