### **Diabetes Association To Seek Funds**

Diabetes is the leading cause of new cases of blindness in the United States, according to Dr. Joseph L. Izzo, president of the Rochester Regional Diabetes Association. Diabetes ranks seventh as a cause of death and third as a cause of blindness, he said, and seven out of ten diabetics die of diseases of the blood vessels.

The American Diabetes Association plans to make November the high point of its year-round battle against diabetes.

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Dr. Izzo said "Besides causing blindness, diabetes has many complications. It's impact can be felt on virtually all systems of the body. Diabetes-caused car diovascular degeneration alone can lead to many serious health conditions."

The discovery of insulin in 1921 was a milestone in diabetes research. It gave the diabetic some control over his disease and allowed him to live an almost normal life. But according to Dr. Izzo even insulin sometimes cannot prevent the dreaded complications.

"The only answer is a cure," he said. "Our aim during November is to make the public aware of the dangers of diabetes and to ask for financial assistance to continue our work. Every time someone makes a contribution - be it time or money — we're one step closer to a cure."
