## Pope Hits False Teaching On Marital Infidelity

Vatican City [RNS] — Pope Paul has scored as "false teachers" persons and groups that attack marriage by showing themselves "indulgent" toward divorce and extramarital sex.

Such persons and groups, he said, "have done much damage by making their voices heard throughout the world."

The Pope was addressing members of the General Council of the Pontifical Commission for Latin America, meeting in Rome on the theme, "Marriage and Family in Latin America."

The pontiff drew attention to various "crises and contestations," which he said were "infecting" the family, contrasting these with the Church's "conviction" of the permanency and unity of marriage and family.

Among the factors adversely

affecting marriage and the family today, he said, are "lack of understanding between generations, increase in divorce, selfish refusal of new life, marital infidelity, and irregular unions."

Causes of these "aberrations," the pontiff continued, included "lack of a sense of responsibility, and lack of sense of sin," which, in turn, he added, is "often an effect of insufficient education, immorality of environment, and neglect of spiritual values."

Deploing the "insensitivity" of those persons and groups that "deny the values of conjugal morality" and "show themselves indulgent toward divorce and extramarital experiences," Pope Paul said:

"These false teachers have done much damage by making their voices heard throughout the world."

## Odenbach Named to Diocesan Post

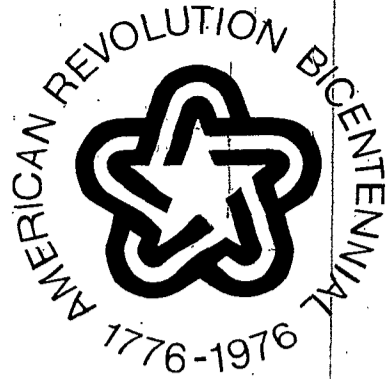

## Your Heritage

Nov. 13, 1633; Nov. 14, 1958 — Adjacent in day, though far apart in years, these two dates were marked by important Catholic utterances on human

dignity and liberty. On Nov. 13, 1633, the Catholic Lord Baltimore, sending forth from England the pioneers of Maryland, who were of mixed faiths but under Catholic leadership, instructed them to respect each other's religious beliefs and sensitivities: "And this to be observed at Land as well as at Sea"

In 1958, the issue was not religious liberty but racial justice. The 1950's was par excellence the decade of the desegregation movement. On Nov. 14, 1958, the Administrative Board of bishops of the National Catholic Welfare Conference issued a statement pointing out that "the heart of the race question is moral and religious: it is rooted in the sacred dignity of each human being and the fundamental rights of man." — Rochester Diocesan Bicentennial Committee.
