## Divorced Catholics Plan Conference

Boston [RNS] - Some 500 people from across the country gathered at the Paulist Center here for the 4th annual National Conference for Separated and Divorced Catholics.

Attendance, up from 300 last year, was the highest ever, and 50 elected delegates from local groups moved to develop an organizational structure by setting up a 14-member steering committee.

Taking note of the presence of participants from Montreal and Toronto, as well as 30 states of the U.S., the organization was named the North American Conference for Separated and Divorced Catholics.

Father James Young, a Paulist who serves as director of ministerial studies at the Jesuit Weston College in Cambridge, has been serving as advisor to the group and was designated chaplain for the new North American Conference.
