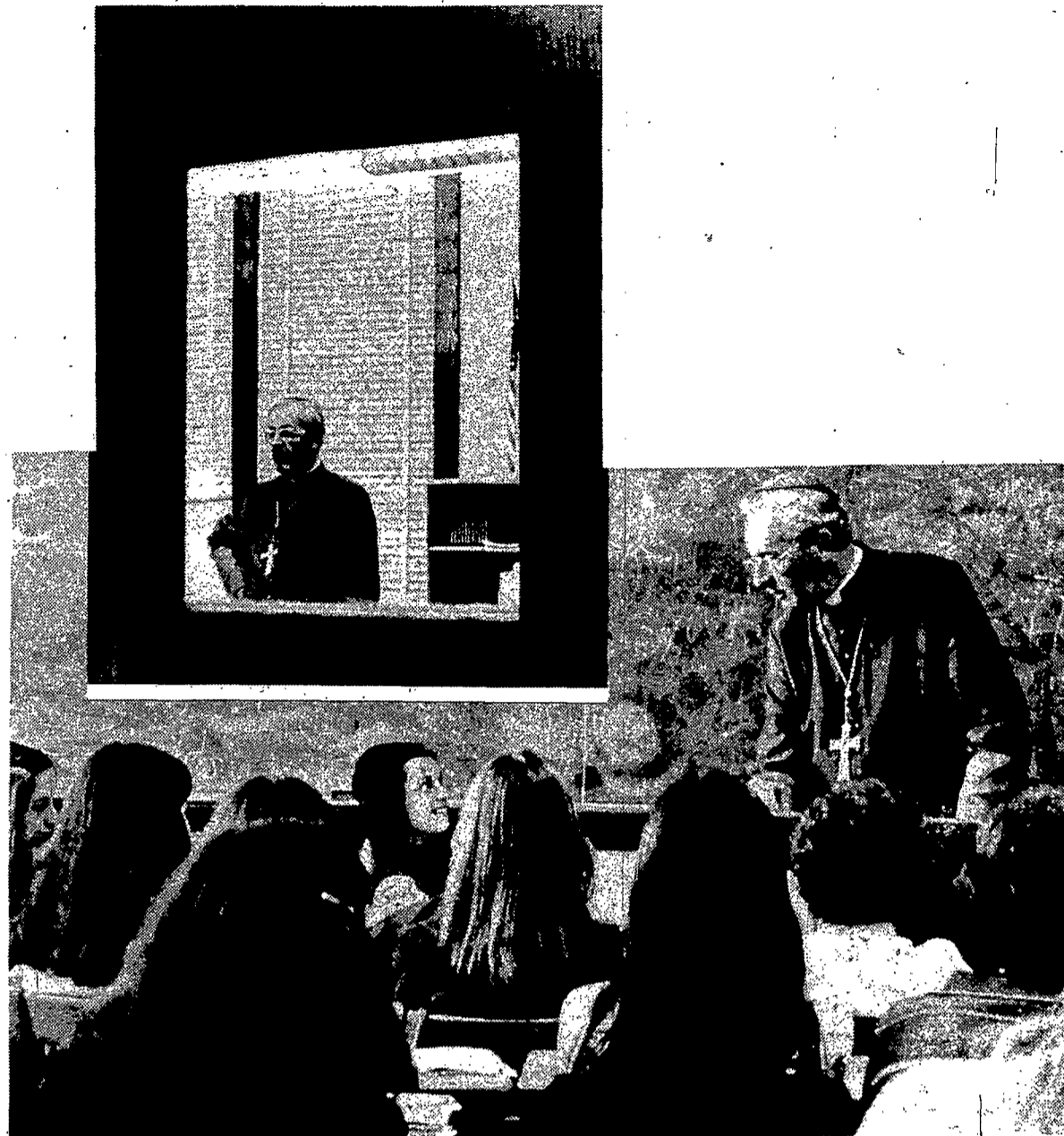

The Bishop Came Calling

"During one summer I painted this whole hallway," stated Bishop Joseph L. Hogan as he stood in the main corridor of Geneva DeSales High School and he smiled at the memory.

The Bishop's visit to DeSales on Dec. 3 not only revived many memories of his years as the school's principal (1953-55) but enabled him to renew acquaintances with alumni who had attended DeSales during those years.

His visit began with the celebration of Mass at St. Stephen's which was followed by an informal "koffee klatch" in the DeSales gym hosted by the Student Council under the direction of Ann Smith, moderator; Melanie Mantell, president; Mary Beth Walsh, vice president; Sharon Maher, secretary and Jamie Welcher, treasurer.

The Bishop warmly greeted parents, students, faculty and enjoyed sharing his memories as principal with everyone. He remembered the football team as being pretty good, the baseball team as excellent but the basketball team as not having fared so well.

His morning continued with visits to the various classrooms where he put the students at ease with humorous anecdotes, interested questions about their school activities, and compliments on their fine school spirit. The Bishop's open friendliness created an immediate rapport with the young adults who delighted in chatting with him. "He's very easy to talk with," they all agreed.

Later in the morning he met with the Student Council for a session which was a mixture of fact-finding information and advice. He questioned the council members about the organization's function and

responsibilities, and told them how important leadership was in creating a good spirit.

He encouraged them to begin their meeting with a "few minutes of reflection" because they would need "spiritual guidance in achieving their goals.

The Bishop told his young listeners, "The great salesmen for the school are the students themselves," and he emphasized their motto should be "Up with DeSales."

In referring to last year's critical decision to close DeSales the Bishop declared, "The crisis united the community in a common effort to save the school."

The success of these efforts was evident in the pride and spirit with which the school greeted the Bishop, and because of his sincerity, graciousness and encouragement the DeSales spirit will continue to grow.
