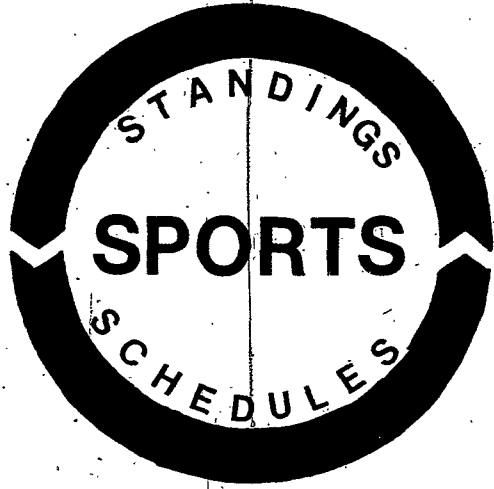

A Look at their Community

Talk about investigative reporters! Recently, there were 27 of them pounding the pavement researching various community services.

The reporters were St. Agnes High School juniors and seniors from Sister Christine Welch's English publications class.

Armed with notebooks, tape recorders and a desire to find out about their community the students interviewed school bus drivers, Family Court probation officers, firemen, editors and mail carriers.

The research and interviews were conducted during the students' own time — after school and on weekends when the people they contacted had the time to participate. The young adults found the interviewees interested and willing to give information on their respective services.

The project which was an attempt to obtain interaction between community resource persons and students for training purposes not only meant interviewing but also compiling the data into informational reports.

Junior Karen Koster devoted 3 1/2 weeks to her task. She interviewed city and town firemen and learned "Firemen are down to earth" people. They want to

help the community any way they can."

Her report included the firemen's emphasis on the needless danger of false alarms and according to one firefighter most of the people who call in these false alarms are between 14 and 18.

Susan Lansky, a junior, investigated nursing careers. She talked with student nurses at Highland Hospital, devised questionnaires for them to answer, recorded duty experiences of surgical nurses and compiled her findings into a nine-page report. Time spent? Four weeks.

But she thought the time well spent. "I think the kids can benefit from something like this, because you learn a great deal while doing it."

Radio station WDKX was junior Bridgette Burch's target. She wanted to find out "if it really was serving the community the way it was supposed to."

Bridgette was interested in discovering how the radio personnel planned and implemented the programs for other people's enjoyment. And in her interviewing questioned the station's staff as well as its listeners.

She concluded: "On the whole WDKX seems to be pleasing the community. Most people seem to like it."

"Permanently Handicapped; but Important and Useful Citizens" was the title of Kathy Seifert's thesis. She interviewed the professional staff of Monroe Community Hospital as well as the patients.

She enjoyed doing the project and commented, "I learned that the handicapped are willing to do something for their lives and not feel sorry for themselves."

Jennifer Facey took an in-depth look into the black community's newspaper, "The Communicator". As she had worked with this newspaper during the summer, and is planning to study journalism she decided she'd conduct her research in this field.

After completing her project, she emphasized, "Writing takes a long time," and acknowledged, "I like the interviewing best — to actually go out and talk with the people."

Much ground was covered, many questions asked, and many hours spent slaving over their reports but all the students agreed they wouldn't hesitate to do another assignment.

Their ideas about this type of English project was summed up by senior Ann Ackerman who declared, "I learned a lot more than I ever knew because I obtained the information from the people who are involved."
