Conlin Heads Cancer Drive

Thomas P. Conlin of 1411 Jefferson Rd., Pittsford, has been named Residential Chairman for Monroe County's 1976 educational and fund-raising drive for the American Cancer Society.

Conlin, vice commander of the Rayson Miller Post of the American Legion and a member of the Knight of Columbus, will head nearly 11,000 volunteers next April. They will distribute pamphlets on cancer detection and solicit funds to support the programs of research, education and service to cancer patients carried on by the American Cancer Society.

OHD Launches 'Rice Bowl'

The Office of Human Development has launched a program called Operation Rice Bowl to increase awareness in the diocese of world hunger, and to supply some funds to help the hungry of the world. The OHD has asked the parishes of the diocese to sponsor this family activity.


Families participating would make the main meal on Wednesdays during Lent a special one, focusing on world hunger. Prayers would be offered, and a cardboard rice bowl would be placed on the table for offerings from family members. The money then would be collected in the parish rice bowl in church. Funds collected would be used to help relieve hunger in the diocese and throughout the country.

The program is offered as spiritual preparation for the 41st Eucharistic Congress scheduled for Philadelphia next August.

Information about Operation Rice Bowl has been sent to each parish. Those participating are asked to notify the OHD of their commitment by Jan. 15.

You even hear it from the college football recruiters. "Get me some of those hard-knocking kids from the coal-mine area of Pennsylvania, and I'll give you some football players."

That Pennsylvania produces more head-banging college football players than most other states is pure myth.

Perhaps for the first time in history we are able to prove some things about which areas grow the most players, per capita.

This is the result of my Football Writers Association membership, which makes available to me a survey from the NCAA Statistics Service. Jim Van Valkenburg says it is the first time such a survey ever has been conducted. His outfit checked out every player on every roster of the 134 major college teams. In all, the survey checked out the origin of 12,792 players from major football schools.

Let's first bust the Pennsylvania myth.

Pennsylvania is third in the

nation in population rank, behind only California and New York.

But as for breeding football players in per capita volume, Pennsylvania ranks no better than 13th in the nation. It did have 788 players on the 1975 season rosters — but this breaks down to only one football body for each 15,001 humans in the state.

Okay. The winners are: Louisiana, 20th in population rank, but one varsity football hunk for every 8,480 citizens. Numero Uno. Ohio and Texas are close seconds, per capita.

California is 20th, per capita, but more players, 1,307 to be exact, have come from California than from any other state. But then California is number one in population.

Number 2 populated New York State was not even in the top 25, per capita.

Now get this: Metropolitan New York had 603 players in major college football, more than all but three complete states (Texas, Ohio, Penn).

And Metropolitan Los Angeles was a close second.

On a per capita basis, we go back to the Ohio breeding grounds, where Youngstown-Warren Ohio, and storied Canton-Massillon Ohio, were first and second, respectively.

So the place to find football players — not from the coal mine areas or the plains of Texas — but from the sidewalks of Fun City. Now, for the first time, you can look it up.
