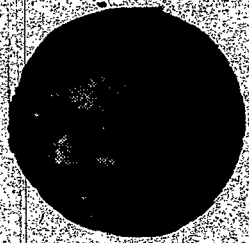

For those of you who need my selection in order to go the other way, here is the 'Practically Peerless Prognostication:

Dallas 17, Pittsburgh 14.

The defending champion Steelers probably will be better than a touchdown favorite at kickoff time on Super Sunday 10, but I do not regard the Steelers as anything yet approaching a dynasty. The Cowboys came out of nowhere this season with a blend of kids and old pros. They were simply dynamite in the playoffs, while Pittsburgh could have been had by an Oakland team that refuses to play opportunist. (I do not like to lodge claims of foul, but there was a matter of 2:33 remaining on the clock, Pittsburgh in possession, when the officials permitted the chronometer to run down to the two-minute warning without the Steelers putting the ball into play. You know Oakland was within one pass of winning at the end, the officials have not yet explained why they did not enforce a game delay penalty at that point, and I guess we never will know the answer, if any. End of bellyache.)

Anyway, Roger Staubach is more stable than Terry Bradshaw, and therein lies the difference in my handicapping. I only hope the game is better than most Super Bowls, about seven of which were dogs. Incidentally, the favored team has won seven of the nine.

It is a particularly trying week for the Working Press. Better than long rainouts in Boston for a World Series, with open bars, day and night. The Super Bowl press entertainment tab is astronomical. It is the softest touch week of the year for the traveling typists. 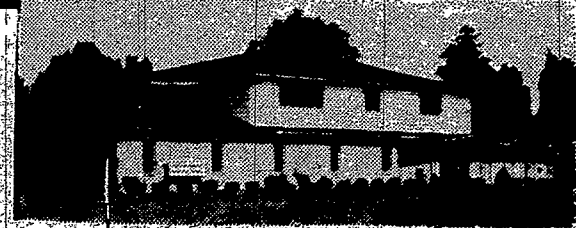
