Hopscotching The Sports Beat and noting that local sporting press critics are nearly unanimous in wondering why the University of Rochester continues to shun the Lincoln First College Basketball Tournament. That No. 8 bracket is the emptiest slot on the entire local sports calendar. Statistics turn me off most of the time but O.J. Simpson's 1975 figures are simply stunning: He broke the world's record with 23 touchdowns; his 1,817 yards on the ground is third only to his own 2,003 in '73 and Jimmy Brown's 1,863 in '63. He also caught enough passes to help quarterback Joe Ferguson set a club record of 25. And O.J.'s most emphatic stat: 228 yards in 28 carries against Pittsburgh's super Steel Curtain.

ADD BUFFALO BILLS INTELLIGENCE: The fans who turmoil in Rich Stadium may not be the best behaved in the NFL, but they are the "most" Buffalo led the league last season, ahead of big city franchises like Detroit (No. 2 in attendance), Dallas, New York, Chicago and Los Angeles. This made it three years in a row the upstate franchise led the entire NFL. The paid attendance was 537,619 for an average of 76,802 for seven regular season games. Rich Stadium has sold out for 15 of its last 21 regular season contests in three years. Capacity is 80,020. Without O.J., there wouldn't be a Rich Stadium. He's 28, with seven seasons behind him since Southern Cal.

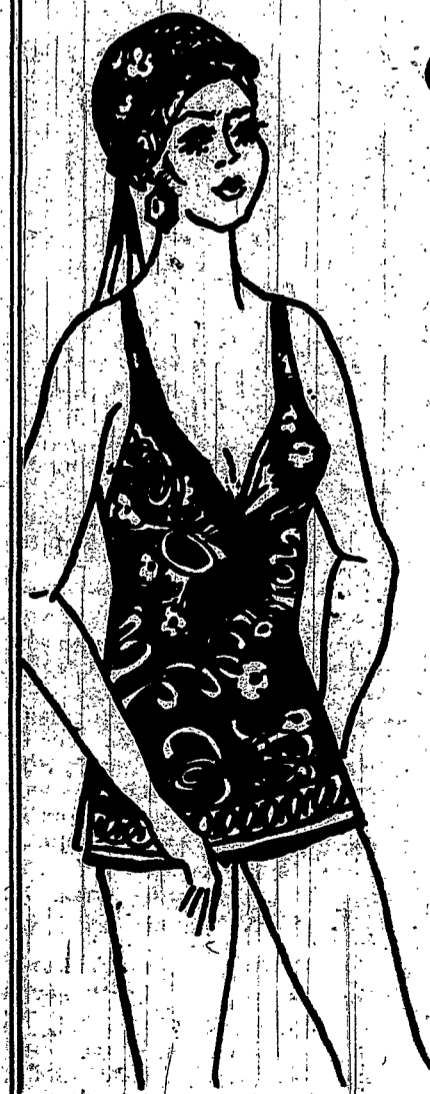
