AQUINAS

To start Catholic Schools Week off at Aquinas there will be an Aquinas-Nazareth interdepartment faculty meeting where teachers will investigate and discuss the various departmental curricula and programs in their respective schools.

This seminar is a prelude to the Feb. 25 inter-faculty program being coordinated by Aquinas and Nazareth which will include junior high school faculties.

The Aquinas Parents' Board will meet on Tuesday, Feb. 10 and on Friday, Feb. 13 there will be a faculty social.

Fathers Albert Gaelens, principal, and John Murphy, faculty representative, will close out the week by attending the U.S. Basilian High School Administrators Meeting in Albuquerque, N.M. where they will share their academic ideas and expertise with fellow educators.

BISHOP KEARNEY

"Catholic Schools Week," stated Brother William Stoldt, principal of BK High School, aims at awakening the historic sense of American idealism — an idealism that shares a partnership with religious and moral maturity.

BK's theme for the week is "Declaration of Interdependence. Education based on two traditions: Catholic and American." To follow through with this theme there will be a bicentennial mass celebrated on Friday, Feb. 13 for the student body.

The week will also include freshman registration, and a freshman-sophomore parents' information night on Thursday, Feb. 12.

To appropriately begin the week the DeSales School Board will meet on Monday, Feb. 9, and issue a statement reaffirming their belief in Catholic education.

Tuesday and Wednesday are set aside for freshman registration and also on Wednesday there will be a karate demonstration presented at a special assembly.

On Friday, Feb. 13 a pep rally is scheduled and each class will present a skit to the student body. Poster and hall decorations focusing on a Catholic theme will be on exhibit throughout the week.

A variety of activities involving faculty, students and their parents are being planned over at 1001 Lake Ave.

The Nazareth Academy Band will present a concert to Sacred Heart Cathedral school students on Tuesday.

A Spelling Bee for the whole school is being sponsored by the English Department faculty and The Art Department plans a Snow Sculpture on the front lawn.
