## TM Is Religious

Editor:

In your Jan. 14 edition, Martin Toombs did a creditable job in presenting a balanced viewpoint of the TM controversy. Unfortunately, when coupled with Father Graf's article, most people have interpreted the entire back page of that Courier-Journal as an unqualified Catholic endorsement of Transcendental Meditation.

Although we are certain that Father Graf was sincere in his appraisal of TM, it would seem to us that your loyal readers in the diocese should also have the opportunity to be exposed to the opposing viewpoint. This viewpoint is very concisely expressed in a TM article which appeared in the Dec. 28, 1975 edition of the "National Catholic Register" newspaper. In this article, reference is made to Victor Kulanday, a Catholic journalist of India, who has made a special study of Hindu occultism. In the October 1975 issue of his magazine "The Laity" Kulanday points out that TM is purely religious (Hindu) by the public confession of Maharishi Mehesh Yogi (the TM "founder"). Kulanday stated that the invocation of Shiva, one of the three gods in the Hindu trinity, is preliminary to the effects supposedly achieved by the maharishi. Kulanday goes on to quote an author in a British journal who stated "for the Maharishi, meditation involves intense concentration upon self. In contrast, Christian meditation is Christ centered and God-oriented. TM is anti-intellectual in that it negates the use of the mind; Christian meditation involves the use of all the mental faculties. TM involves the opening of the mind to dangerous Satanic influences and is not concerned in the battle with sin and evil. Its purpose is not to make man a good and useful member of society; it is to take away stress sin for the Maharishi is merely an active mind."

The claim that TM is not religious is very difficult for us to comprehend. During a standard TM initiation rite, participants are asked to bring an apple, flowers and a white handkerchief which are placed on an altar in front of a picture of Maharishi. Incense is then burned, accompanied by the chanting of Vedic hymns. This rite, plus the comments stated above, plus the alleged "power" of the secret word or mantra, clearly establishes TM as being highly religious and something that we as Christians and Catholics should not become involved in!

We sincerely hope and pray that nothing in this letter will be considered as a direct or implied condemnation or judgment on anyone or any group. We are all God's children and we are all called to love one another even in our differences of opinion.

Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth and the life; no man can come to the Father except by Me" (John 14:6).
