I am not an active member in the Right-to-Life committee but when they held their recent march downtown I talked my husband and seven of our eight children into going. We were all favorably impressed with the good turnout of supporters who, despite the severe cold temperature, showed up to be counted as those against abortion.

However I was disappointed in the apparent lack of the clergy

present. I was even more concerned with this lack when, on the ride home, one of our children voiced his feelings about it. Our nine-year-old said, "I thought Father said in Church last Sunday that it was real important for everybody to go to this march. I only saw two nuns and no priests marching though. Why, Mom?" The only excuse I could come up with was to tell him and the others that perhaps they felt it would be more effective if the march looked like a laymen movement. It was a pretty feeble excuse tho and I didn't really believe it nor did my kids "buy" it, I'm afraid.

I do feel that, even if this was the real reason for their absence, the altar of St. Mary's should have been crowded with priests for the hour long service that followed the march. I realize that nuns and priests have busy schedules. At our home the kids weren't eager to give up their Saturday activities but they did. Two missed a bowling party, one missed a skating party, one gave up a baby sitting job, another wanted to work on his car and one had spent five hours taking a college entrance exam all morning and was tired (our five-year-old leads a very dull social life and had nothing better to do anyway).

It seems to me if we expect the laity to get behind this movement wholeheartedly to repeal the abortion law we're going to need support and encouragement from the presence of our clergy to insure its success!

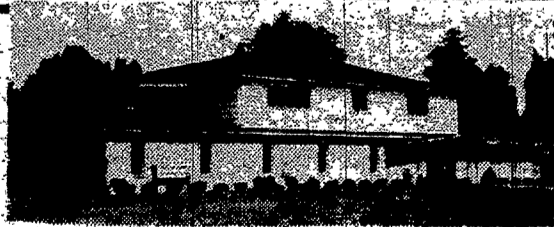
