

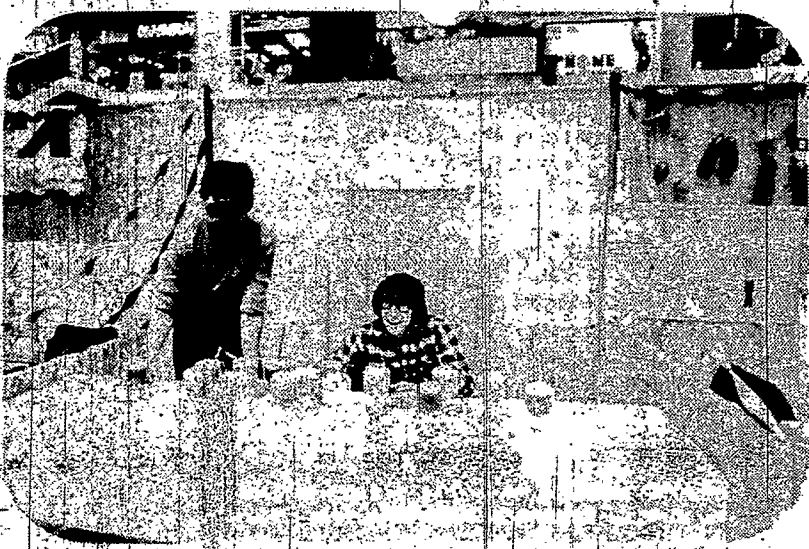

American Legion Scholarships

The American Legion Auxiliary of Monroe County wishes to contact high school seniors who are daughters of veterans of World War II, the Korean conflict and the Vietnam conflict, to acquaint them with the many opportunities being offered by the American Legion Auxiliary to help them further their education.

The following is a list of scholarships and financial aid available to graduating seniors planning on entering college in the fall. Awards are based on actual need, character, Americanism, leadership and scholastic standing.

Monroe County Committee offers a one-year scholarship of \$400 to a girl in the field of nursing, teaching or technical course.

Department of New York offers a \$1,000 scholarship to the daughter of a deceased veteran of any of the above mentioned wars who died while serving in the Armed Forces or as a result thereof.

Past Presidents Parley awards a \$1,000 scholarship to a girl for basic preparation training in nursing.

Department Student Nurses Scholarship. Ten scholarships will be awarded, one in each district, in the amount of \$500 to girls in their senior year who are in actual need of financial assistance to become registered nurses. They must be daughters of veterans.

National Presidents' Scholarship. Ten scholarships will be awarded, two in each division to boys or girls who are children of veterans. One scholarship is for \$1,500 and the other for \$1,000.

Rochester Philharmonic Music Director David Zinman will audition each of the award winners for a possible solo appearance with the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra at the joint RPO/Rochester Philharmonic Youth Orchestra concert at 4 p.m., Sunday, March 28 at the Eastman Theatre. The combined orchestras will perform Respighi's Pines of Rome; the remainder of the program will be determined by Mr. Zinman's auditions of the award winners.
