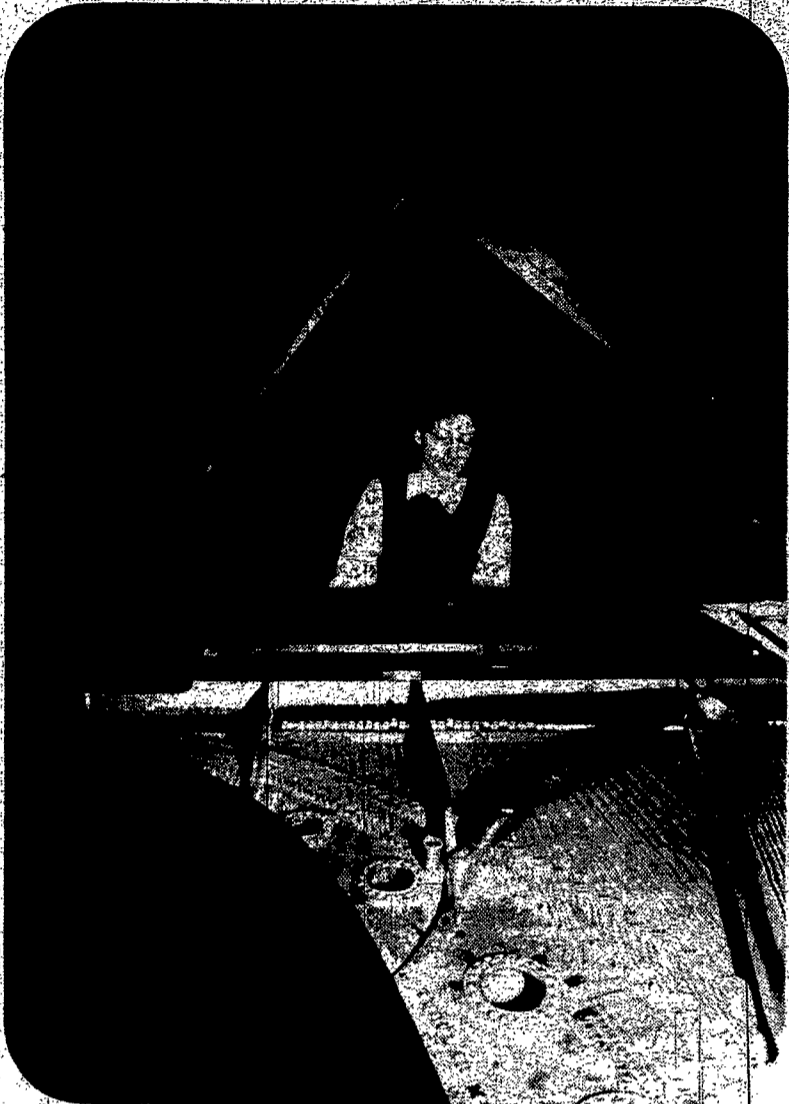

Mercian Janet Starkweather entertains fellow classmates with a piano recital during the Music Day celebration.



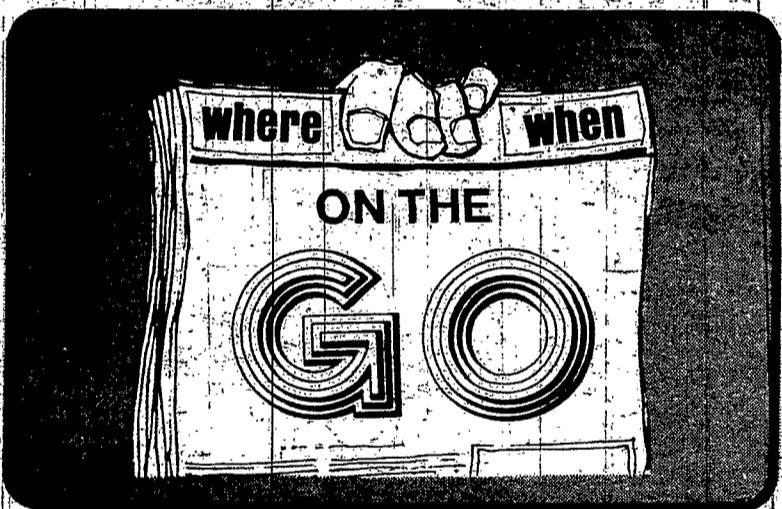

Saints, Good but Small Notre Dame News

Geneva — With a student population of only 250, one might expect that the quality of play exhibited by the DeSales High School Saints basketball team would be far below that of larger schools. But as many sports writers and opponents have recently learned, this is not the case. DeSales, a class C school, ended its season in first place in the Western division of the Wayne Finger Lakes League which consists of Class B and Class A schools.

While the Saints have met with success in their own league, their most notable achievements have been in their non-league contests. Last summer DeSales Coach John Fitzgerald did what most coaches would have considered damaging to an expected successful season.

Fitzgerald scheduled two non-league games with AA schools and two with AAA schools. Many students and players had their doubts about how the Saints would do against these much larger schools.

The Saints came through with flying colors. Not only did they beat Bishop Grimes (AA) twice, but they also beat Penfield (AAA) before bowing to Edison Tech (AAA) in the finals of the Penfield Christmas Tournament.

The key to the Saints success has been good, unselfish team play and a 6 foot 4 center, John Serafine, who hits shots from all over the court. Serafine has averaged 25 points and over 10 rebounds per game. Serafine's supporting cast consists of 6 foot 4 Bill Tapscott and 6 foot 1 Tim Tapscott at the forward position along with Lou Quethero and Chris Lavin at guard. Guard Steve Visco and reserve center Tim Riley are both capable substitutes and give the Saints great depth.

The Tapscott brothers work with Serafine to control the rebounds and trigger the Saints fast break. This combination has led the Saints to a 16-2 season which put them into the sectionals. Editor's note — DeSales lost to Kendall High School in the March 10 Sectional game, 77-43.
