



Rite Airs 'Work' Concerns

More than 250 persons braved the ice storm which swept through the area on Ash Wednesday to attend a noontime ecumenical service at St. Luke's Episcopal Church.

The service, billed "Ashes and Hope," was designed by a number of civic and religious leaders to give a forum for the unemployed to express their needs and elicit a response from the Christian community.

A statement prepared for distribution at the service reads in part:

"Those of us who profess allegiance to the teachings of the God of Abraham, Isaac, Jacob and Jesus, believe we must move beyond prayer and discussion to do the following: Organize both the unemployed in a new kind of union, in order to: Educate our-

selves to develop such political and economic sophistication so we can: Act upon such knowledge to bring effective pressure to bear upon local state and national officials so they will realize that people of faith in this country will no longer tolerate the incredible inequities of the present socio-economic system."

Father Henry Atwell, pastor of St. Agnes Church in Avon, was prevented by the storm from attending the service, however, and from distributing the statement.

Drafters of the statement included Jean Cardinale, Office of Human Development; Rev. Bruce Hanson, rector of St. Luke's; Rev. Clyde Mellenger, pastor of Webster Presbyterian.

The service consisted of Scripture, intercessory prayers and the distribution of ashes. Following

the service, members of the congregation were invited to speak with representatives of several job opportunity agencies.

Others participating in the service were Herman Stoll, Talent Bank Associates; Loren Curro, Roy Rugless, Youth Services of Action for a Better Community; Robert Walter; Lucy Sewell of Gaining Resources for Older Workers.
