## Unique Music In Concert

The Aquinas Institute Concert Band under the direction of John Lyon will hold its annual spring concert on Sunday, March 28 at 8 p.m. in the Aquinas auditorium. The performance will include music from three different centuries.

The program will open with the Philip Browne march, "Suite No. 2" which was written a century ago in honor of the then major general, Ulysses S. Grant. This musical performance will be followed by two 17th Century madrigals by Thomas Morely, and then the band will swing into a popular vein with the score from "Jaws."

Joining Aquinas for this concert will be the Nazareth Academy Band under the direction of Sister Beverly Jones. Combined, the bands will play "The Spirit of '76" an arrangement of traditional American melodies.

A concert feature will be "African Trilogy," an original composition written by Peter Candela, a 1973 Aquinas graduate. The center section of the band in performing this score will be patterned after the ancient African marimba bands. Wind instruments will be used to produce sounds of the African jungle as the composition brings together both ancient and modern Africa.
