Aquinas Prominent Name In Athletics Hall of Fame

Last week five Rochester athletes (some still quite active) were inducted into the Monroe County High School Athletes Hall of Fame at a dinner-dance at the Holiday Inn Downtown.

Of the five inducted, one was from Aquinas Institute; of the 16 nominated for induction, three were from Aquinas; of the 15 athletes who now make up the Hall of Fame, three are from Aquinas.

It's not coincidental Aquinas has produced more athletes for the local hall of fame than other schools; the Little Irish have been in the sports business for a long time.

For the record — among this year's nominees were former Aquinas athletes Dick Buerkle, Chuck Maloy and John Parrinello.

Buerkle was inducted along with track star Jack Dianetti, bowler Millie Martorella, speed skater Janice Smith and basketball player Walt Dukes.

Buerkle, who teaches Spanish at Bishop Kearney and is one of America's leading distance runners who hopes to make the U.S. Olympic team for this summer's Games in Montreal, joins Aquinas grads Terry Diehl and the late Don Hollender as members of the Hall of Fame.

Diehl, of course, was inducted two years ago for his achievements in pro golf. Hollender was one of the five original inductees for his football exploits at Aquinas and West Point.

Buerkle lettered in football, swimming, cross country and track at Aquinas and later, at Villanova, won the NCAA championship in the indoor, two mile and outdoor three and six mile events in 1970.

In 1972 and 1973 he was national champion in the 5,000 meter run and won the same event in the U.S.-Soviet competition.

Recently Buerkle's been experiencing a physical ailment which causes a shortness of breath, obviously a liability to a runner, but he is optimistic that he will be in good condition for the Olympic trials in June, at Eugene, Ore.

Last year Buerkle won the 10,000-meter run in Peking and two years ago his 13:23 time in the 5,000-meter run gained him the fourth spot in the world and first in the U.S. in that event.

The two other Aquinas nominees scored their points on the football field.

Maloy was known as "Chuckin' Charlie" when he quarterbacked Little Irish football teams under Coach Mickey Connelly in the late 1940s, and he went on to earn All-America honorable mention at Q&B at Holy Cross.

Parrinello played baseball and football for the Little Irish and won MVP honors in football in 1955.

He graduated from the University of Rochester where he captained the football and baseball teams and also starred in track.

Parrinello won Little All American grid honors at the U. of R. and was awarded the coveted Lou Alexander Student-Athlete award. He played briefly with the New England Patriots of the then AFL.

Others nominated for induction into the local Hall of Fame this year included diver Carolyn Bennet, soccer player Guy Bonfiglio, gymnast Jim Culhane, football player Jim Cripps, swimmer Betty Hushla, swimmer Russ Janneck,

baseball player Dave Ocorr, and basketball player Andy Spennacchio.

Next year five more will be inducted and the odds are fair to good one will be from Aquinas.

Mooney Grad Earns Award

Michele Ann Hank, a 1971 graduate of Cardinal Mooney High School, has been notified by Zonta International that she has been awarded an Amelia Earhart Fellowship Award.

She will continue in graduate school at the University of Minnesota in aerospace engineering and mechanics where the award will help in her research in parachute technology.

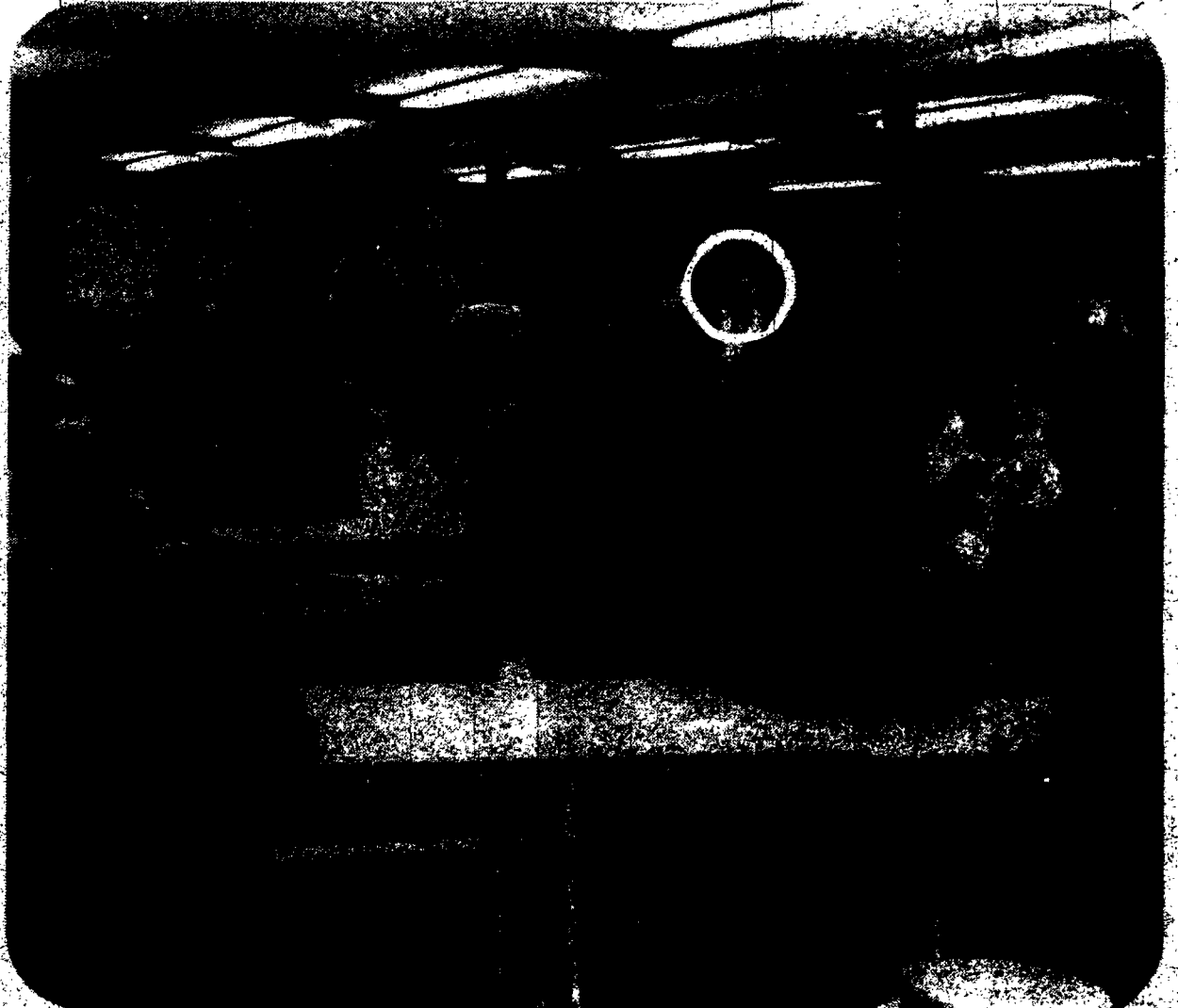
In January at a meeting of the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics in Washington, D.C., she presented a paper, "The Aerodynamic Development of a Gliding and Steerable Parachute."

Among her other achievements is her consideration by the National Aeronautics Space Administration (NASA) as first woman candidate for astronaut training.

If she is accepted for this program she will report to the Johnson Space Center in the Fall of 1977.
