CDA Cites Trucker For Missions Help

The president of a Rochester trucking concern has been cited as an "outstanding citizen" by the Catholic Daughters of America.

For helping Court Our Lady of the Cenacle in its work for the missions, Robert Kleisley was given a "meritorious award" plaque to hang in his office at C&M Forwarding.

According to Mrs. William E. Crosby, the court's charitable works chairman, members were

making so many bandages for the Catholic Medical Missions Board that shipping costs became a problem. Kleisley offered to take the boxes as space allowed on any truck dispatched to the neighborhood of a medical missions warehouse.

Mrs. Crosby reported that for the past 12 years Cenacle Court members had been collecting used sheets and converting them into cancer bandages. The total for the past two years was 8,502, she said.

Nazareth Hikes Tuition, Board

Nazareth College has increased its full-time undergraduate tuition from \$2,340 to 2,500 a year, and room and board from \$1,454 to \$1,550 according to an announcement last week by Dr. Alice L. Foley, president. The increases will be effective beginning with the 1976 fall semester.

Costs for Continuing Education and graduate students will be raised \$5 per credit hour, Dr. Foley said. Part-time students will pay \$65 per credit hour for undergraduate courses and \$75 for graduate courses beginning with the 1976 summer session.
