

It is over a year since I met Father Stephen A. Chomko at St. Casimir's Forty Hours in Elmira. He is a Ukranian priest of the Eastern Rite and pastor of St. Nicholas Church in Elmira. Heights. 1 asked him "What of your people! Do they suffer the puzzlement that so many of the omissions and changes have brought to the Western Church! "No! We are not held to the liturgical changes of the Latin Church. Our people! love their traditions and music and ritual Eastern Rite Liturgy is rich in symbolism, ceremonial and mystery. It is part of the very life of our people."

"What about the instruction of the young?" I pursued. "We use some of the catechetical material offered by publishers. I like "Scope" especially. But we always use as a basis The Baltimore Catechism. This presents Catholic doctrine clearly. It is memorized by our children and becomes a store house of religious doctrine for their adult life."

A month ago an invitation came from St. Nicholas Church Com-mittee inviting me to the 30th anniversary of Father Chomko's ordination. It meant five hours of driving byt my regard for the priest and the Eastern Rite impelled me to the Elmira Heights' church. The anniversary Mass was at 4 Sunday afternoon, April 25. I arrived about 4:15, at the beautiful tan brick church. It is only 20 years old -and is debt free! The interior has the traditional iconostasis, that large decorated wooden screen, with the three doors opened during the liturgy. This preserves the sense of holiness for the sanctuary where the liturgy is celebrated. It is covered with symbols of the Most Blessed Trinity and bright Byzantine paintings of Christ, His Mother, the Apostles and other saints. The tabernacle is a small replica of a gilded Byzantine church. The church was filled with parishioners and well-wishers. Visiting Ukranian priests and also Latin priests from Elmira, Corning, Addison and Waverly area were up front.

Each worshiper had a missalette with the Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom in English and Ukranian, even as we used to have our English-Latin missals. The worship was flowing and devout. The Mass lasted 45 minutes. The people made the responses and entered into the prayers with the ease of a familiar community. The prayers of the liturgy are a wondrous combination of prayers similar to the Jewish prayers which Jesus prayed and the developments from the soul of the Church from its beginnings. Horace Greeley advised a young man seeking money: "Co West, young man; go West." Would that our Western innovators might go East for a genuinely sacred and moving liturgy. No part of the Mass was more thrilling than when the congregation burst into a hymn sung in their native tongue, sung in parts, with the base notes like the deep notes from the bourdon of an organ.



After Mass a dinner was served to a crowd in the parish hall, with girls and women serving in native attractive blouses. The dinner was sumptuous. The speeches were many but brief. Greetings of the clergy were eloquently delivered by Father Adamski. And as a finale Fr. Chomko reminisced about his first assignment at the age of 25, fresh from Catholic University, to a tiny parish of 18 Ukranian families in the mid-west; with an area which had a radius of 500 miles to cover. The priest paid tribute to his late
