The Artistic Faces of Paper

Sara Solaun, a Nazareth Academy sophomore, is just the person to look for when one would like to learn about Origami. She was always interested in this ancient Japanese art of paper folding and decided to do something about it after entering Nazareth as a freshman.

In her Asian-African Cultures studies in ninth grade, her class was given a special Japanese art project to do. Sara took out books from the library on the subject and became so immersed in origami that after presenting her project, she went on in her study. She found herself becoming more and more advanced in the topic and soon she was making everything from paper dice to attractive hanging mobiles.

In January of this year, Sara became interested in the 4-H Club and with the help of some friends became an active member. She has, as of this date, entered two competitions sponsored by 4-H with her Origami and both times received a blue ribbon for excellence and a certificate for a job well done.

Through these presentations, many people have seen Sara's work, and since then she has been a guest speaker with her presentation at meetings of different clubs and organizations around Monroe County.

Sara has learned much from her study of Origami. Not only is one able to construct varied objects from paper but this art teaches a person many lessons in self-discipline and concentration, she

says. Because of the many intricate folds you are faced with, one may achieve patience. She also feels that one attains a consciousness of harmony within oneself and nature because choices must be made from the variety of sizes and colors of origami paper best suited to the object you are constructing. Origami often is therapeutic for the rehabilitation of damaged hands.

People find it interesting when Sara mentions that those who have become experts in this art are capable of constructing a model with a one square-inch piece of paper! Sara herself has attempted this and concedes it is a challenge but a very rewarding one. Sara stressed, "Origami is not merely a traditional amusement but ranks equally among such forms of art as painting and sculpture."
