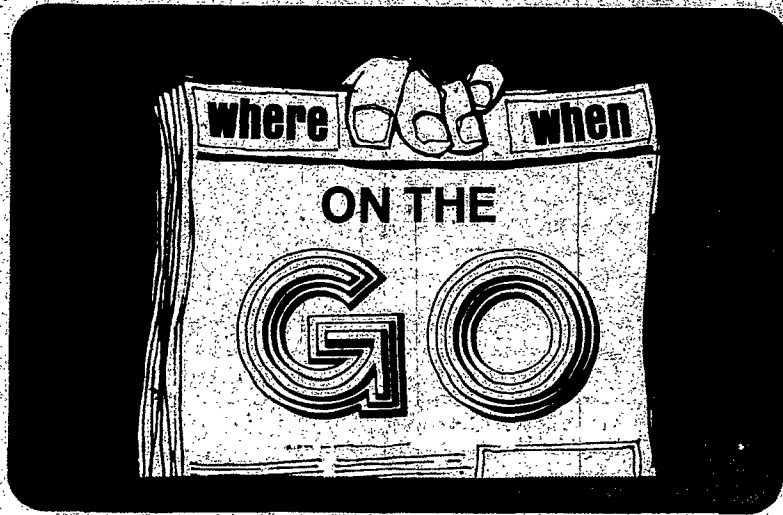

More Awards For Artists

Of the 108 regional finalists in the Scholastic Art Awards Show at Sibley's last February, 25 have won honors in the recent National Scholastic Art competition which consisted of winners from 52 national scholastic regions. Two award winners are from area Catholic high schools.

Ralph Esposito of McQuaid won an Honor Award in photography for his black and white "Watchful Eyes." His entry will be shown with other national winners in the Kodak Gallery, Avenue of the Americas, New York City from Aug. 17 to Oct. 16.

Nazareth artist Doty-Robidoux received honorable mention for her textile design "Those were the Days."

Honors consist of gold medals on walnut plaques, each engraved with the winning student's name, and honorable mention certificates.

Photography winners received Awards of Excellence (\$100), Honor Awards (\$20) and Kodak Medallions of Excellence.

BK Student Wins Merit Scholarship

Luidvikas Bukys of Bishop Kearney High School was awarded a four-year Rochester Institute of Technology Merit Scholarship.

Luidvikas' field of study is computer science. He is a member of the National Honor Society, the National Forensics League, and also a member of the Charismatic Prayer Group.

A total of 1,485 winners of college-sponsored four-year Merit Scholarships were announced by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC) of Evanston, Ill. This was the last of three nationwide announcements this year that together covered a total of about 3,830 Merit Scholars who will receive awards valued at more than \$10 million.

About 14,000 semifinalists advanced to finalist standing by meeting requirements that included confirming their earlier high test performance on a second examination, being recommended for Merit Scholarship consideration by their high school principals, and presenting records to support high academic standing. In recognition of distinguished performance in the competition, Certificates of Merit were mailed in February to all finalists.

Aquinas Stage Set for Comedy

The Aquinas Performing Arts club will present the comedy, "There's a Law Against Bigamy" on Friday, May 14, and Saturday, May 15, at 8 p.m. at Aquinas Auditorium.

The play is set in a college town and recounts the hilarious proceedings of a young professor who "hates" females but who is in the process of selecting a partner with a view to marriage.
