JA Honors Business Enthusiasts

Cardinal Mooney, Nazareth Academy and Mercy students received special honors at the eighth annual Junior Achievement Future Unlimited Banquet on May 4 at the Dome Arena. This event honored the 1336 students who participated in this year's JA program to learn about business through the practical experience of forming and operating their own companies.

Suzanne Wall, named President of the Year, is a Cardinal Mooney senior and has been a JA member for two years and president of the King Dyno-mite Co. counseled by Rochester Products. She is a Stella Maris camp counselor, a Student Council representative, and a member of the Mooney field hockey team. Her plans include a four-year nursing course at Niagara University.

Anne stated that the greatest benefit of belonging to the JA organization for her was "getting to work with other people and getting the most out of everything you try to do."

Mercy senior Jean Ver Hoven, Junior Business Woman of the Year and winner of a \$500 scholarship from the Xerox Management Association, has been in JA and has worked for the Delva Co. counseled by Gleason Works, for three years. She also is a member of the aviation branch of the Rochester Products Explorer Post and has taken a course in engineering graphics at Rochester Institute of

Technology to prepare for her future career in engineering.

Kathy will attend Nazareth College to prepare for a career in elementary education.

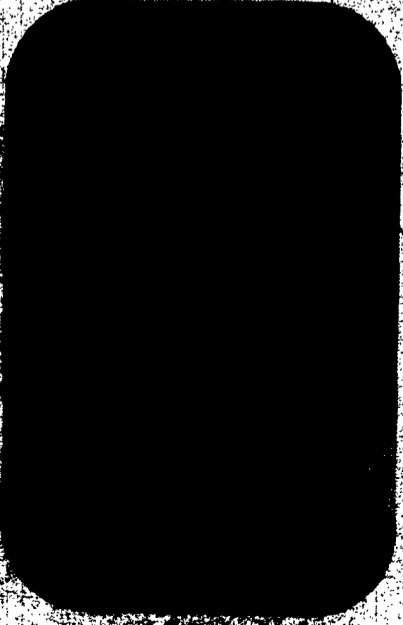
