Aq Debate Club

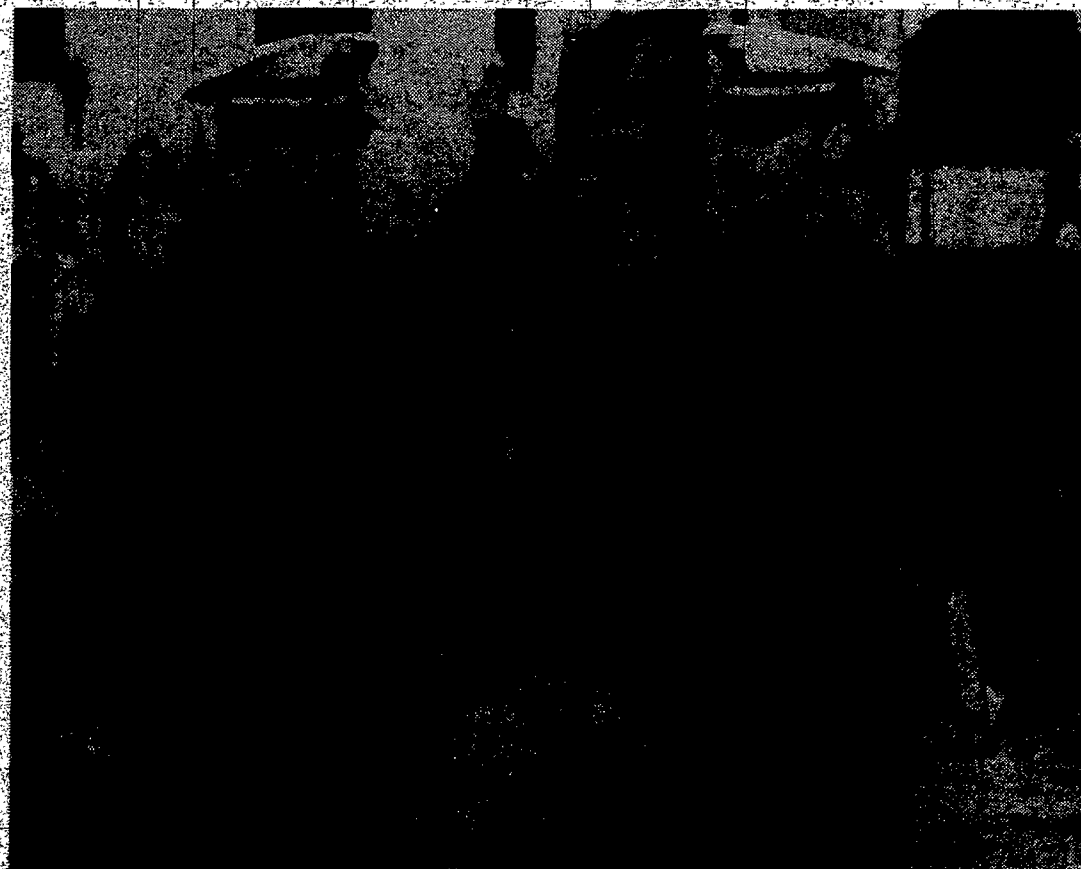
