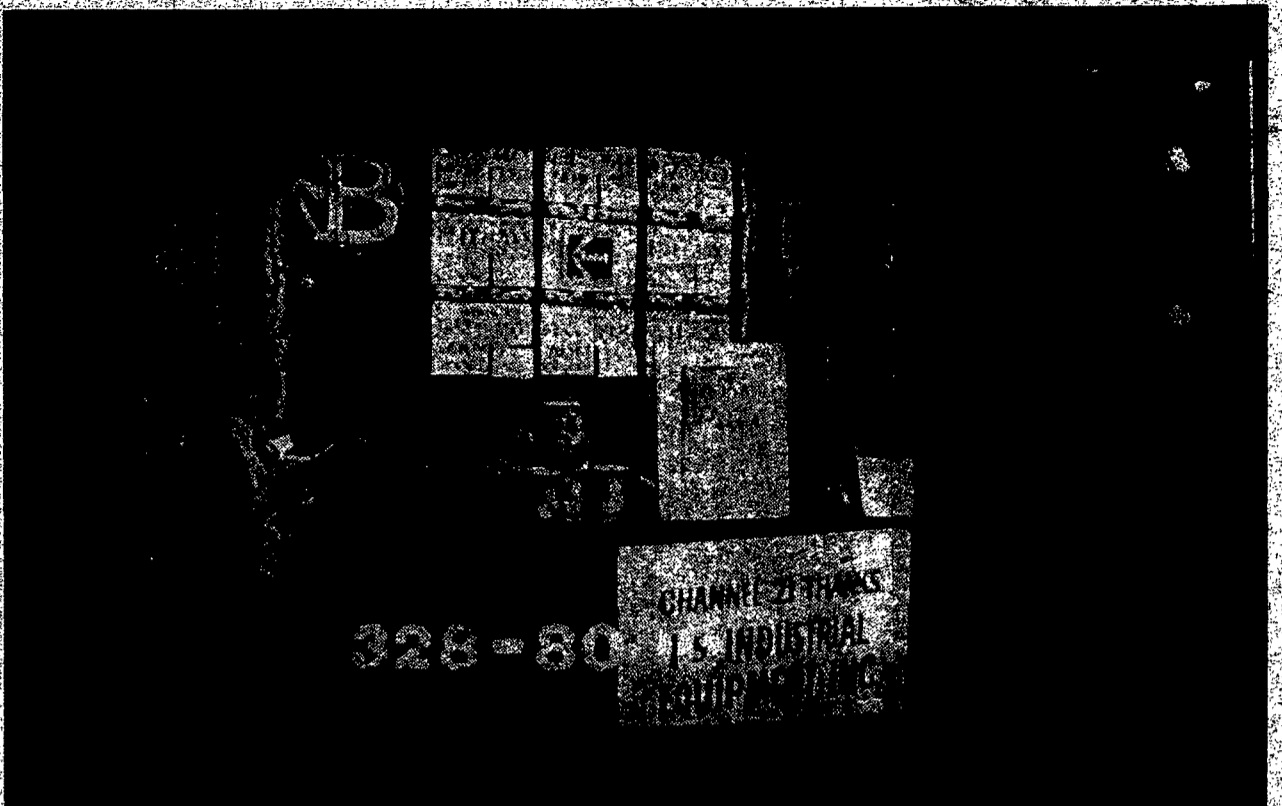

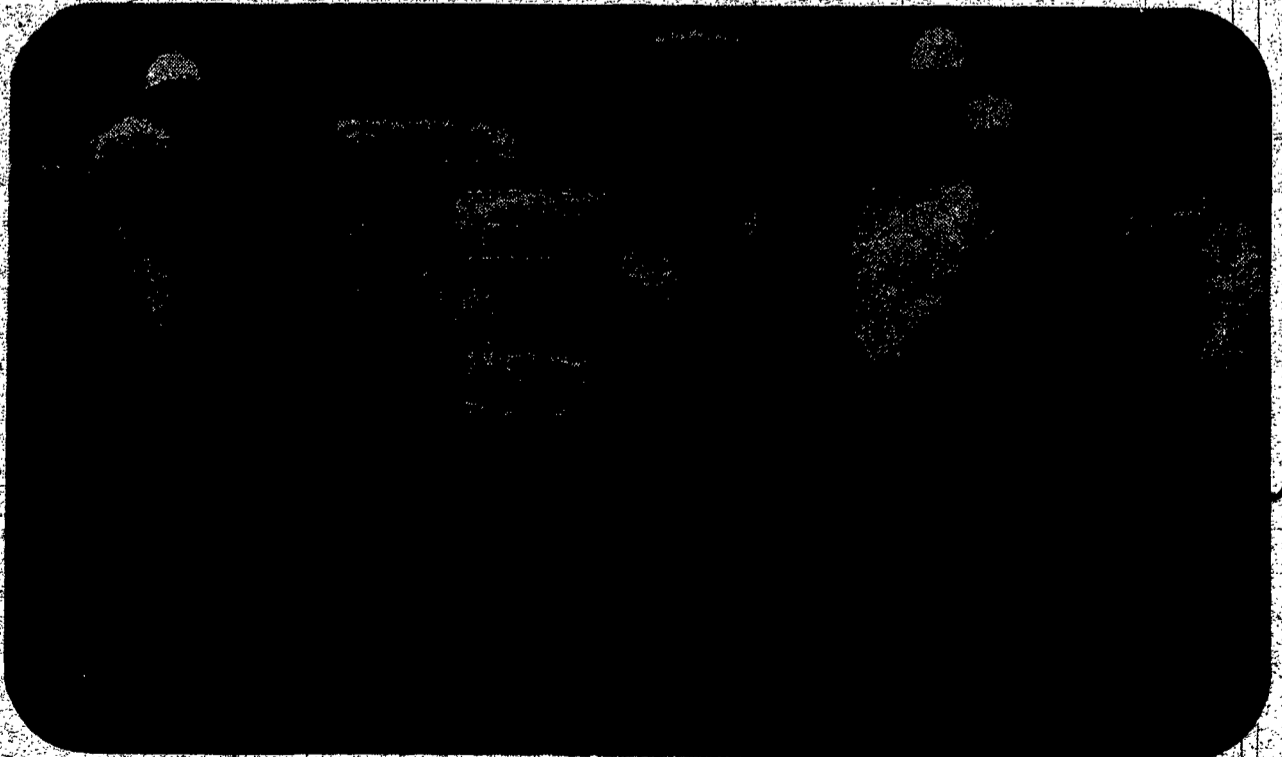
for the press corps, maintaining the teletype machine, and running errands.
