Aching Feet!

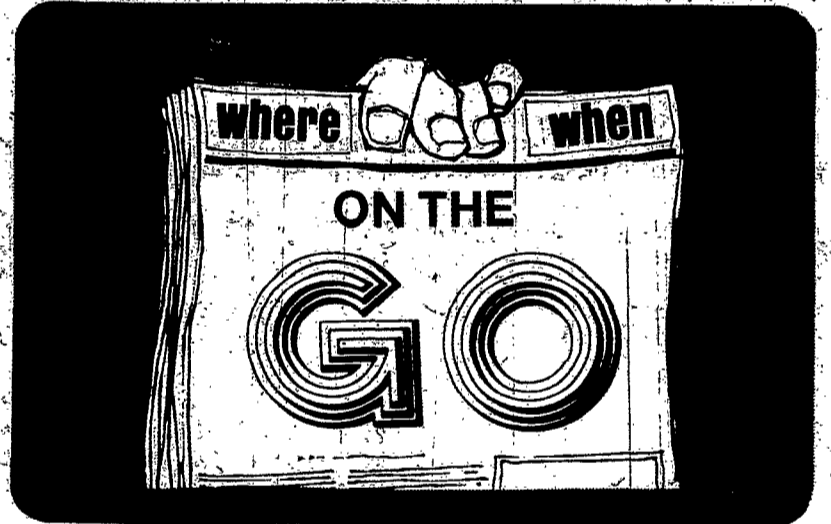
