

The program covered layout, typography, photography and merchandising. The seminar's objectives were to inform and inspire the yearbook staffs and advisers.

Apparently it accomplished its goals as, according to Pam Blake, editor of Mercy's Veritas, "It was a real good session especially the layout segment."

Coeditor of Cardinal Mooney's Apogee Pam Biracree picked up on some "good ideas for covers," and the other editors found the special

In discussing the factors which contribute to the success of yearbooks, Ellen Mouio, Nazareth's Lanthorn editor, commented, "What's really needed are people who can come all the time.

Once school reopens in September "all the time" will mean everyday after school until 5 p.m. and then back again in the evening until 10 p.m.

Both Ellen and Mark agreed that getting organized is really the most important factor."

Tom Rosica, editor to Aquinas' Arete remarked, "A good variety of items dealing with activities of all the classes is important." To accomplish this goal the Arete staff checks with the moderator twice a day to find out what is going on in the school.

The use of color is becoming popular in the yearbook formats. The Lanthorn, and Crown and Scepter included color photos in this year's issues and Aguinas indicated it will incorporate color into next year's Arete.

There are yearbook award competitions and the staffs will be working with that aspect in mind but their main concerns will be to meet deadlines so the books will be distributed on time; and that the finished work will combine the finest in creative efforts of staff and advisers which will be a credit to their schools.

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
