Cardinal Mooney's history teacher, Brother John Davies, had a few surprises handed him on the last day of his Russian History class.

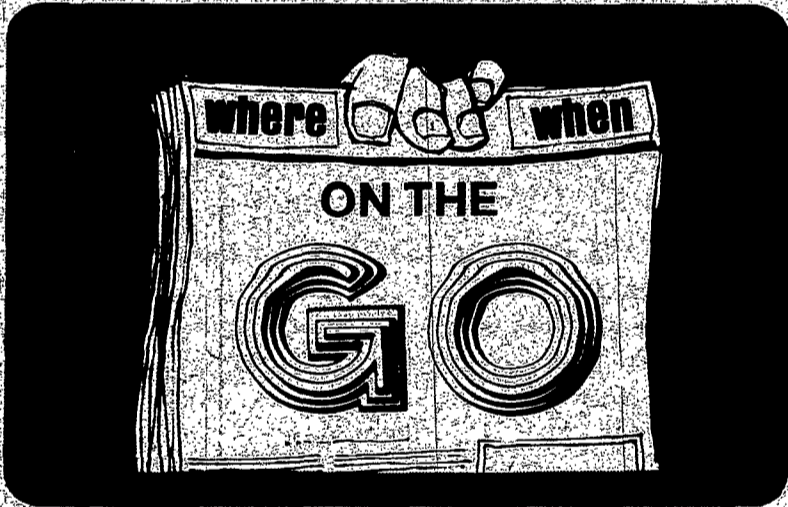
