Deaths

Salvatore Ciaccio

Mass of Christian Burial took place Monday morning for Salvatore Ciaccio, 78, who died Thursday, July 22. Burial was in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery. Mr. Ciaccio was a member of St. Rita's parish.

"Sam" Ciaccio, as he was known among his many business associates and friends, devoted his life to assisting his fellow man. Director of the Wegman Foundation and an active member of the Community Chest, Mr. Ciaccio was born in Italy in 1898 and resided on Lake Road in Webster.

In 1914, when only 16, he joined the then fledgling Amalgamated Clothing Workers Union as an organizer. He worked in Passaic, N.J., Montreal, Hamilton, Ont., and Jamestown, N.Y., as well as throughout Western New York.

In Rochester, Mr. Ciaccio was identified for more than 40 years with Fashion Park as the union's chief business agent. In recent years he serviced Xerox, Rochester Buttons, and Bravo-Macaroni. He was president of the Rochester Joint Board of the Amalgamated from 1935 to 1965.

An early advocate of industrial unionism, he was chairman of the old CIO council in Rochester, and upon its merger with the AFL became executive vice chairman, serving from 1959 through 1964. In the mid-30's, he ran unsuccessfully for the State Assembly and always enjoyed strong interest in politics as a lifelong Democrat.

Among his many friends, he prided himself on his friendly relationship with Rochester industrialists Edward Rosenberg, Joseph R. Wilson, Neil Broderson and Horace Gioia, among others. In pioneer union years he met and worked with Sidney Hillman, John L. Lewis, Philip Murray, and others on the national scene.

He is survived by his wife of 52 years, Carrie Sisca Ciaccio, and his son, Arnold Ciaccio, Irondequoit.
