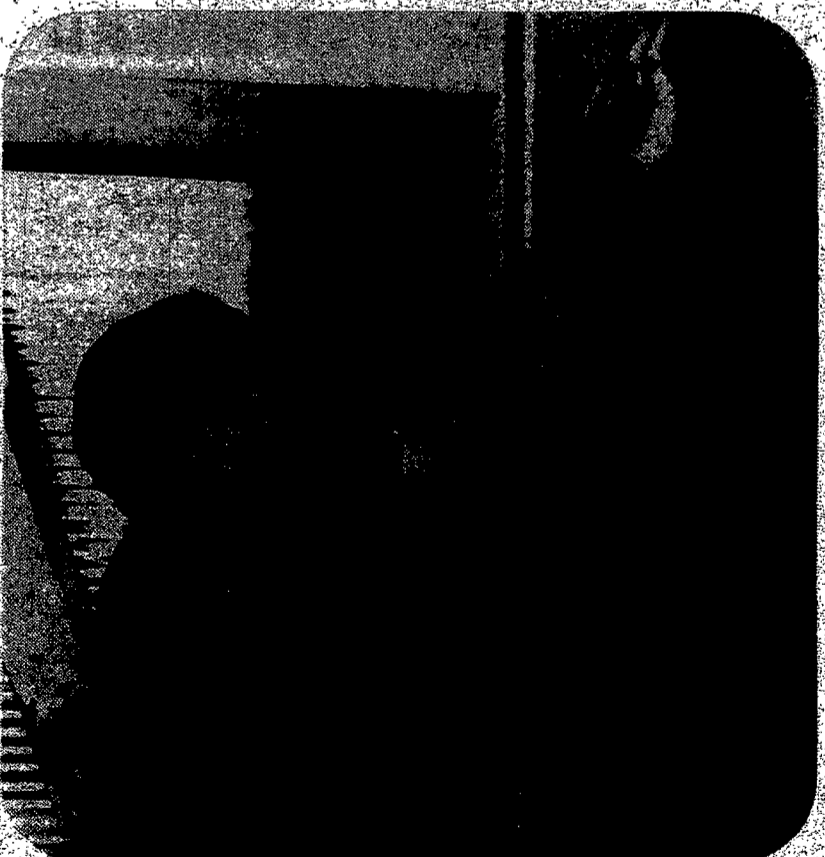

Bias, ERA Draw CDA Disdain

New Orleans [RNS] — The Catholic Daughters of America (CDA) adopted a resolution stipulating that "no Catholic woman is discriminated against due to race or color in any court within this Order."

Mrs. Phyllis Scharly, national chairman of "Stop ERA," told the 36th national biennial convention of the Catholic Daughters here that the proponents of ERA are unable to cite specific laws which discriminate against women and which would be remedied by adoption of the amendment.

CDA delegates also adopted a resolution reaffirming its opposition to ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) and calling on members to work for its repeal in those states which have ratified it.

The resolution on the ERA and the one prohibiting discrimination of Catholic women in CDA courts were among 22 adopted.
