Dear Father Hohman,

You and your type of young priest cause many of us much concern. It is not that we are better than you; in our personal lives we are infinitely worse, but we cannot help but be concerned by the failure of the younger clergy to abide by authentic Catholic doctrine. And you needn't take issue with me on that, either — I mean the doctrine that has been taught for 1900 years and has been affirmed by all the recent Popes, including Paul VI. In the name of "dialogue," "updating," "Vatican II" and other euphemisms they hope to introduce a modernistic, humanistic doctrine resembling modern Protestantism, including birth prevention, a memorial service instead of the Holy Sacrifice, women priests etc.

Humanism or making man's needs the criteria of doctrine instead of the commands of God, has been condemned by the Popes since Erasmus introduced it in the Renaissance.

Modernism, or as we now know it "updating" of "Vatican II" [bearing no resemblance to the real documents of Vatican II] has been condemned since the 19th Century.

The Lord established a male priesthood since the choosing of the house of Aaron by Him in the old testament — he did not change this order in the New Testament, even for His mother. Women were told to be subordinate to men [but not a chattel] by St. Paul. This was to be for their protection in the kindness of God. But now we have many religious rebelling against such proven Bible teaching and claiming that St. Paul was just affected by his "cultural" heritage. The Bible is the word of God inspired by the Holy Spirit — I would like to remind such people that the Holy Spirit when teaching a truth was able to keep the truth

from being altered by "cultural" influences, or they might as well throw out the whole Bible. No, they do not throw out the whole Bible — just the "cultural" part they do not like.

Dear A.J.O.,

You bring up so many items that I need to answer them in single sentences and I will number the sentences.

1. You are not infinitely worse than anyone. We all are in the same boat.

2. Thank you for conceiving me as being among the younger clergy.

3. You, like many other people who object to the changes since Vatican II, seem to think that Catholic teachings and practices were static and unchanged for 1900 years and that there was no development in those teachings and practices throughout those centuries. There certainly can be a development of doctrine as the collective church grows in wisdom and grace. You have been deceived into believing that the precise same teachings of 1950 were in existence in the year 100. Please study the history of, for example, the sacrament of penance and you will find little resemblance between the two.

4. Your reference to the Lord establishing a male priesthood since the choosing of the house of Aaron by Him in the Old Testament is simply your statement. It has little or no value in terms of theology. I say this without malice, but you are, as an amateur, making statements which require professional expertise. Women were subordinate to men in the time of Christ not because they are inferior but rather because that was the social condition of the time. You may or may not remember that St. Paul told slaves to be obedient to their masters but that doesn't make slavery a Christian belief or acceptable to Christians in any way shape or manner. It merely reflected the actual social conditions of that time.

5. You speak of the Bible as inspired by the Holy Spirit in a totally literal way so that the words must be taken at face value. Going back to the last sentence I would merely ask you — if St. Paul told slaves to be obedient to their masters does that make slavery acceptable to Christians? It would seem to say so in the Bible by your standards of measurement.

St. Patrick's School closed in 1974 and Sister Angela now devotes

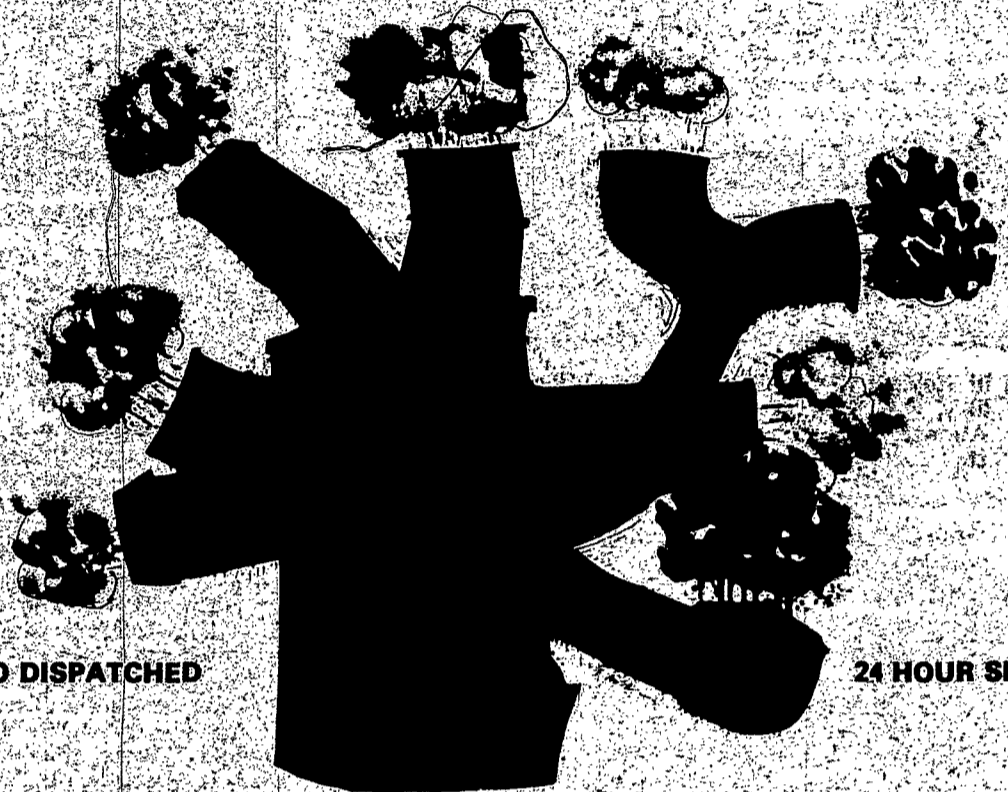
her time to calling on the ill of the parish and community and helping the needy.
