Atheists Demand \$100 Million from Catholic Church

Vatican City (RNC) — A group called United World Atheists, which claims Madalyn Murray O'Hair, the American woman who led the fight to ban mandatory school prayer in New York, as its president, has demanded that the Roman Catholic Church pay a \$100 million "retribution" to atheists.

The retribution would cover alleged "atrocities" committed against atheists over the past 20 centuries.

The group also demanded that the Church stop preaching about sex and "stay out of the bedroom."

United World Atheists, which says it is a "loose but determined affiliation" of atheist organizations in eight countries, said in a handwritten statement that Mrs. O'Hair had delivered the group's demands to the Vatican Secretariat for Non-Believers.

Vatican sources described the group's demands as absurd.

Volunteers Needed For Inmate Project

Choice, the counseling program which teaches inmates decision-making, will hold a training weekend for volunteers at Blessed Sacrament School, Oxford Street and Monroe Avenue, Oct. 9 and 10. More than 30 persons in the Monroe County Jail have asked to be included in the next cycle, and new recruits are needed to serve them all.

The program aims at changing the inmate's view of himself from born loser to self-determiner who can take charge of his life. This is done in a structured series of meetings between inmate and counselor which show how to separate situations from feelings and choose among possible courses of action.

Volunteers are trained in the initial two-day weekend plus several follow-up sessions. Those who attend in October will be ready to counsel one of the waiting inmates by mid-November.
