"This year, 1,779 graduate and under-graduate students are enrolled. But the graduate schools have been an enormous burden to the University. In Taiwan, graduate students not only do not pay tuition, but also receive a stipend for pursuing their studies. In addition, the University has to assume responsibility for subsidizing overseas students from Vietnam and Cambodia. Because of expansion in the graduate studies program, a new building is now in the planning stage."

"It is indeed a very generous help to us that we will be able to work better in our 'barrios.' Some of the 'barrios' are as far as 27 and 30 kilometers from the village, and no public transportation reaches some of them. The Sisters have to walk, under the tropical sun, around two hours every Sunday, after having ridden a public truck for more than another hour. By 6 a.m. they leave the Convent, some of them do not return until 2 p.m. and some others until 6 p.m. They arrive at the convent exhausted, but happy after having directed the Bible Service for the faithful gathered in an enclosure.

The need of a jeep is urgent, not only to fulfill the pastoral duties on Sundays, but also to transport the lay catechists who assist the Sisters, and have to commute from the village to the 'barrios' to teach religion in the rural public schools during the week days.

"The money will be used to install a telecommunication system for our nine mission stations. They are really necessary because in our Mission in South West Borneo — which is as large as Belgium — there are 210,000 inhabitants, and there is no communications. We can only reach three of our Mission Stations by motor-bicycle. So it can take weeks before we have contact with our missionaries at their stations.
