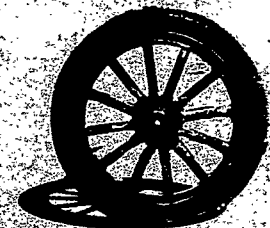

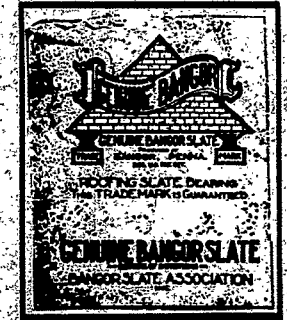
It will be the largest combined garage sale and auction that Monroe County has ever seen.



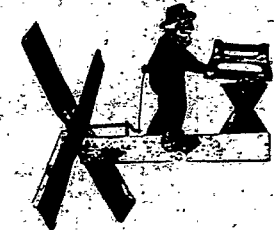

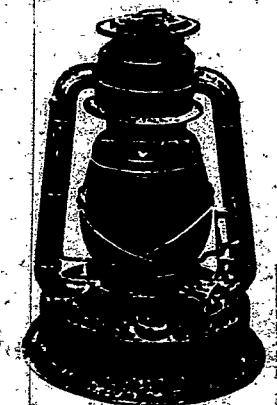
