City of Rochester Plans Garage Sale, Auction

The City of Rochester's combined auction and "garage sale," the largest ever in Monroe County, will take place from Thursday, Oct. 28 to Saturday, Oct. 30, at the City's Department of Public Works storage facility at 6626 McKee Road (near Buffalo Road).

The sale will feature valuable antiques such as a roll-top desk in "mint" condition, historical documents, surplus police vehicles, trucks, heavy equipment, wooden spoke car wheels from the 1920s,

New York State license plates (1918 to 1928), old fire plugs and call boxes, office equipment, old wooden furniture, municipal signs, kerosene lanterns, and thousands of other items of both antique and practical value.

The unprecedented local event will offer tagged items valued at less than \$1,000 for purchase garage-sale style from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Thursday, Oct. 28 and Friday, Oct. 29 and from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturday, Oct. 30.

Census Initiated By Elmira Parishes

Elmira — Our Lady of Lourdes, St. Casimir's, St. Mary's, and St. Patrick's will join forces to conduct a house to house census to update parish statistics from Oct. 29 to Nov. 11.

The census is designed to obtain general information about Catholics living in the Greater Elmira area. Father Francis Davis, pastor of Our Lady of Lourdes; Father Henry Adamski, pastor of St. Casimir's; Father Joseph Egan, pastor of St. Patrick's and Father John Leary, pastor of St. Mary's, have notified their parishioners that each of the approximately 20,000 dwelling units in the city of Elmira and the towns south to the Pennsylvania border will be visited.

Commenting on the program, Father Leary stated, "It has been over 11 years since a Catholic census was last taken. During that time many of our people have relocated throughout the area."

More than 1,000 volunteers will handle the census contacts under the leadership of chairpersons Mrs. Robert Dowd, James Howland and Joseph McClusky of Our Lady of Lourdes; Mrs. Genevieve Mazur, Mrs. Janet Wieziolowski and Mrs. Nancy Yonko of St. Casimir's; Stanley Douglas, Frank Maloney and Mrs. Mary Robinson of St.

Mary's, Jack Gordon, Gerald McLaughlin and Andrew Molly of St. Patrick's.

Primary objectives are to identify all baptized Catholics, noting parish affiliation or lack of it, the ages, and school enrollment of students, and school intent for pre-

school children. Questions will include religious background and practices as well.


NORTHWEST EVENT


